The joys of owning a Corvette?

Gang,

We have the season in full swing now as the weather man decided to skip spring and rip right into summer—hot hazy and humid with thunderstorms!

Rallye 101 was a success and you can read about that on the front page with some great pics. While the autocross season has not officially started for NVCC, none of the competitors have let moss grow under the Goodyears by participating in other Corvette club events. And let's not forget the club's active social calendar as Laurie has things buzzing with talk of new events, a great darts night and a great cruise.

One of the best events of 2003 was the ice cream cruise and Andrej has big plans for this year on June 6th. Three states and BIG pauses between eating food and ice cream. Don't miss it!

I am always reminded of what a great club we have when doing something with a group of individuals. On June 16th, six club members with three trailered cars and two driven met at 6am and drove 148 miles in caravan to Lancaster PA for an autocross. We had a great time, everybody was helping everybody else in the club improve times. There was much discussion of proper lines, when to brake, when to turn in, etc. as we marched around the course together during the walk through. Great stuff and great fun. Those of you who have been intimidated by participating in an autocross in your vette should come out and give it a try. The friendship far outweighs any feeling of not being the fastest guy out there and who knows you might learn something about your car!

Over the last month I had an occasion to have to drive to upstate NY (real upstate, not Utica or Syracuse but Massena on the Canadian border) to support my wife with an ailing mother who eventually left this earth for better territory.

The trips were about 600 miles each way virtually non stop. Up route 15 through Gettysburg/ Harrisburg, pick up 181 to the Canadian border and hang a right for 60 more miles.

There were a number of observations on the journey which we have been doing for over 30 years. For one thing we did not take the Z06. Not that it doesn't get good mileage. On the way back from Lancaster last week I recorded 29MPG! Not that it is too rough riding for such a long journey. The problem is the roads are getting torn up and the number of rock, pieces of metal hitting the car are just incredible. It doesn't pay to have a decent car on some of the interstates today.

The second observation was that this north/south route now is totally dominated by large trucks. They are not nice. No flashing of lights when you let them in, just an attitude of what the h—are you doing on the road? We own it! And moving! I was moving along about 80mph in one section with the radar detector up when here came an empty car carrier doing at least 100. I thought I had the brake on he came by so fast. If that was the only incident it would not have been so bad but it was one of dozens over the month. It is getting really tough out there. Be careful! STW!!,


