Jeff Kirk suggested I share this technical tid bit of information regarding C5s and how to "get into" their onboard computers.

As those with C5s know there are 7 on board computers in a C5 and the Drivers Information Center displays relevant information when pressing certain buttons. For instance the "Fuel" button can display current MPG, MPG since last hitting the reset button, etc. The computers also store information for your local Corvette mechanic to find what the diagnostic capability of the computers have to say about your Corvette. The multiple computers are constantly running diagnostics and storing any error codes in the computers for later lookup. The diagnostic error messages can be quite cryptic such as "10 PCM B2284 H" and without the shop manuals it is tough to understand that the code is indicating an error message in the Power Control Module. But if you would like to see your computers at work doing the scans and displaying the codes, or hopefully the message, "no codes" for each module, turn the ignition on until the display comes up with the motor off, press the reset button on the DIC console, then hold the option button in while simultaneously pressing the fuel button 4 times within 5 seconds and watch your display change! Ah the magic of computers. Neat!

The Robinsons, my son and myself went to a Central Northeast PA CC triple autocross a couple of weeks ago and I noticed something very different from an NVCC event. To put on three Autox in one afternoon is a chore. There were about 40 cars in each event, with two runs per event. What I noticed was how blessed the NVCC is with workers. All the work was being done by basically two or three people with not much club help. If NVCC did that there would be no concour, no Spooktakular, no rallyes, no social. While we sometimes complain about the lack of participation when it comes right down to it when we need people for an event, they show up and work. We should be proud.

Oh by the way something that wasn't unusual at the Scranton triple Autox, was Zoel kicked everyone's butt with three FTDs and Wanda had three FLTDs. Ho hum. Darn they are good!


