Car Batteries by Cassidy Nolen

Ever had that dreaded morning when you find out you have a dead battery? All parts failures aside (like a dead alternator), you can keep on top of it if you know how old your battery is. Most of us have fuzzy recollections about our car batteries. We say things like “well, it was snowing when I changed it” or “I think it was new last year”. The reality is the battery can tell us what we need to know.

By definition, a battery is two different metals contained in an electrolytic solution (or acid). This chemical reaction creates the energy needed to crank and maintain our computer and electrical devices. As the battery ages, it can lose its ability to do this. The metal plates in the battery erode over time and lose the cranking amperage they once had (the number identified by CCA, or Cold Cranking Amps). Batteries differ based on the needs of the car they operate, months of warranty and even use in the country. A battery in Florida would have more electrolyte in it (hotter and it evaporates more easily) while a battery in Wisconsin would have more plate material (colder winter conditions drain the battery and make it harder to start the car).

The life of a battery is directly related to the predetermined number of months a manufacturer expects the battery to last AND the way the battery is stored. Simply driving a car around once every few weeks can keep it going. With this winter, that should be easy. Dead batteries do not always recover if they are left for long periods of time. You can even have a battery freeze solid if the acid becomes pure water! DO NOT CHARGE A FROZEN BATTERY. It is probably time for a new one if this happens.

With all of this said, here’s how you tell the age on your battery. Stamped in the plastic on the top of all AC-Delco batteries is a number. It’s made of little dots that push into the plastic while hot. The first two digits tell us all we need to know. A4xxx, for example, tells us this battery was manufactured in January of 2004. A battery with G5 would be July of 2005. See the pattern? The months are identified by the letters A-M (they leave “I” out, too ambiguous) and the year by the first number. On Interstate and Die Hard batteries, this is a round sticker usually separating the number and letter with a dash.

I usually replace a battery when the manufacture date is within 6-10 months of its life (in other words, I go 50 to 54 months on a 60 month battery). It has been a good rule for me. I also am very careful to buy a battery with a recent build stamp. I actually turned down a battery this past year from a GM dealership that had a date code of 2002! That battery was almost 5 years old! Wherever you go, make sure you are buying a battery big enough (enough CCA’s) and new enough to do the job.

If you were curious, I have run AC-Delco batteries in all of my cars for many years. I purchase the 84 month batteries whenever available. They have a patented sealed-type battery with vapor recovery system built right in. They also have an eye-type hydrometer that tells you whether the battery is charged. They cost a few dollars more, but that is one area I am NOT looking to save money!
