Our very own 2009 Publicity Chairman and Concours Chairman, John Palmgren, visited the Washington Auto Show on



Saturday, February 7th, 2009. While at the show, John was able to sit in one of his dream cars, a 2009 Red Z06, and meet the Corvette Racing Program Manager, Doug Fehan. Unfortunately John missed Mr. Fehan's presentation, but was lucky enough to spend about 15 minutes in a one on one conversation with Mr. Fehan (at right) about the upcoming season.



Per Mr. Fehan, it looks like Corvette Racing is planning to run the current C6.R GT1 class for the 12 Hours of Sebring, the Grand Prix of Long Beach and the 24 Hours of LeMans races and then will transition to the GT2 Class for the ALMS race at Mid-Ohio. Even though most people think that the class change may be a step down. According to Mr. Fehan, this is not how Corvette Racing is looking at it. The competition will be stiff and they are even expecting Audi to have a car in the GT2 class that is based on the R8. Additionally, the driver line-up is changing to include Antonio Garcia who will race with Johnny O'Connell and Jan Magnussen in the No. 3 Compuware Corvette C6.R for the 12 Hours of Sebring, the 24 Hours of LeMans, and the 1000-mile Petit LeMans. Marcel Fassler will be replacing Ron Fellows on the No. 4. Compuware Corvette C6.R with Oliver Gavin and Olivier Beretta. Ron will continue with the team in an advisory and ambassadorial role

CURRENT 2009 NEWS and ACTIVITIES

2009 C6's Production Information as of December 23, 2008:

There have been 13,683 C6's produced for the 2009 model year.

The individual Model breakdown is as follows:

6,855 are Coupes; 2,317 are Convertibles; 3,681 are Z06's and 830 are ZR1's.

To date, the Top Six Corvette Colors produced are as follows:

41U Black 21%; 57U Cyber Gray 20%; 74U Victory Red 14%; 89U Crystal Red 12%;

17U Blade Silver 10% and 85U Jetstream Blue 9%.

Popular Options and their percentage of build are as follows:

Automatic 6-Speed (Paddle Shift) is 67% of Coupes and 79% of Convertibles;

Z51 Performance Handling Package is 36% of Coupes and 32% of Convertibles; **F55** Magnetic Selective Ride Control is 10% of Coupes and 26% of Convertibles; **NPP** Dual Mode Exhaust System is 50% of Coupes and 57% of Convertibles.

The new Base **1LT** Convertible is running 9% of total Convertible production.

GM Statement Regarding High Performance Vehicle Operations:

"Due to a refined focus of work on core products, resources at General Motors High Performance Vehicle Operations (H.P.V.O.) have been temporarily reassigned.

The 60 engineers impacted by the decision are a talented, experienced group and have been placed in other engineering operations of General Motors to work on core, volume products, including further improvements in fuel efficiency and advanced propulsion. These are talented engineers who will add their expertise to the various teams they are joining.

When market conditions and public demand for high performance or specialty vehicles change in the future, General Motors will return these resources to their original tasks."

Just a couple of thoughts: any further engineering improvements into the C6? Is the C7 on indefinite hold? . . . Hennessey takes 2009 Corvette ZR1 up to 755-hp:

As if the 638-hp 2009 Chevrolet Corvette ZR1 wasn't powerful enough already, Hennessey Motorsports has decided to offer two performance package upgrades for the Chevy beast that takes it up to a total of 755-hp.

The first package, known as the ZR700, adds a supercharger pulley and blower snout upgrade, an intercooler system upgrade, a K&N air filter and a reprogrammed EMC (engine management computer). The ZR700 allows the 2009 ZR1 to produce 705-hp with a maximum torque of 717 lb-ft. 0 to 60 mph in just 3.1 seconds with a top speed of 212 mph.

The second package, known as the ZR750, adds everything from the ZR700 package and more for a total of 755-hp with a peak torque of 730 lb-ft. 0 to 60 is cut down to just 2.9 seconds with a top speed at a whopping 217 mph.

2009 Callaway Corvette unveiled:

The latest tuning package released by Callaway Cars for the 2009 Chevrolet Corvette fetches a sticker price of \$18,900 but raises the car's power output to an impressive 580 hp (433 kW) which in turn gets the Corvette an acceleration rate of 0-60 mph in 3.5 seconds to reach a maximum speed in excess of 200 mph.

The Callaway Corvette can cross the quarter-mile in 11.2 seconds at a speed of 124 mph. The Callaway tuning package begins with the LS3 V8 by GM and adds on top of it an Eaton supercharger, a high-flow injected fuel system, an air-liquid converting intercooler and a custom air intake. A hood decal that matches Callaway's 650 hp (485 kW) C16 bespoke speedster is available upon customer request. This package becomes available in conjunction with the opening of its new 27,000 sq.-ft. facility in Corona, California to mark its 20 years of tuning Corvettes.

Gulf One Zo6 top \$1 Million at Mecum Auction:

An icon of 1960s racing, the Gulf One Corvette Z06 racer, was in familiar position last weekend at the Mecum Auction--first. The 1963 car sold for \$1.05 million at the Kissimmee, Fla., event--doubling the price of a 1962 Mercedes 300 SL, which went for \$525,000, not including the buyer's premiums.

The racer is based on a production Corvette Sting Ray. It's one of 14 from 1963 assigned specifically for competition and was one of two outfitted by Don Yenko. It was campaign by Dick Thompson, who was dubbed the "Flying Dentist," to numerous wins, including the Puerto Rico Grand Prix, and a first place in the GT3 class at the 1963 Daytona. It also was a frequent winner at barnstorming events.

The Corvette has been restored to its appearance from the 1963 Sebring 12 Hours, including the modified fender flares that were a last-minute change. Originally, the car was equipped with a fuel-injected 327 V8 that made 360 hp and a four-speed manual transmission.

The Gulf One car was one of several Corvettes that went for top dollar at the event, including a 1969 L88 racer, which went for \$305,000, the third-highest sale, and a 1957 convertible, which was fourth with a selling price of \$250,000.

GM Canada Delivers Plan for a "Leaner and Greener" Sustainable Company:

OSHAWA, ONTARIO - GM Canada today (2-20-2009) delivered an achievable, transformative Restructuring Plan to the Canadian and Ontario Governments and asked for their support to complete the Plan. Despite further North American market deterioration, the Restructuring Plan will achieve long-term viability and enable GM Canada to repay Canadian taxpayers.

The Restructuring Plan has three key components:

- 1. Implement further "self help" cost reduction actions and adopt a new, beneficial "Contract Manufacturer" business model
- 2. Obtain the CAW's agreement to achieve legacy cost reductions and align active worker wage and benefit levels to benchmark levels
- 3. Complete Canadian and Ontario Government Support Agreements for sufficient financing to sustain operations and restructure GM Canada's balance sheet to address unsustainable legacy costs

Restructuring Plan Highlights:

- Maintains GM Canada's share of Canada / US production which is expected to range between 17% and 20% between 2009 and 2014. GM Canada remains one of Canada's largest automobile manufacturers
- Embraces the Federal and Ontario Governments' Principles for proportional production / proportional support vis-à-vis GM in the US
- Requires Agreements with the Canadian and Ontario Governments and the CAW to be completed in March 2009

- Enables the launch of five new vehicles in Oshawa and Ingersoll including new hybrid vehicle production, new flexible transmission production in St. Catharines and significant advanced environmental R&D for next generation electric car systems, with suppliers and universities in Canada
- Adopts more conservative market assumptions
- Retains GM Canada customers, dealer network and new vehicle line-up as the company's top strength and priority
- Contemplates no further GM Canada plant closures at this time, reflecting restructuring actions already announced
- Enables GM Canada to remain Canada's top selling automaker and offer more 2009 hybrid models than any competitor
- Includes shared sacrifices such as a 10% reduction in executive salaries and reduced benefits and pay for salaried workers
- Secures pensions for GM Canada retirees and would establish a "VEBA-like" structure for health care benefits
- Fully consistent with GM's loan conditions with the US Department of Treasury and GM's Viability Plan as submitted to the US Treasury on February 17, 2009
