PRESIDENT'S CORNER October 2009



Fall is already here, the temperatures are falling and so are the leaves. Even so, there are still many more events to take part in over the upcoming weeks.

Last month I wrote about time spent in the rain at New Jersey Motorsports Park (NJPM). This month has brought more rain and once again, I found myself out in the midst of it. This time it was for a 2-hour team kart race on the triple skid pad at Summit Point. In case you weren't aware, they have named the skid pad the Washington circuit. Anyway, this event sounded great when I signed up, along with teammates Andrej Balanc and Cassidy Nolen. A two-hour team karting event under the lights. Teams of three drivers would race in machines provided by Summit Point Karting, around the course, with mandatory pit stops and driver changes along the way. When registration closed a week prior to the event, 17 teams had signed up. NVCC has done this type of event many times in the past at Allsport's warm and dry indoor track in Sterling, with Andrej & I having quite a bit of success. What we hadn't figured on was running in steady rain and 40 degree temperatures the whole time. To say it was challenging would be a gross understatement. To say it was the most abominable driving conditions I have ever encountered still doesn't do it justice. But we were there, the karts were running, and there were 16 other teams of crazies that wanted nothing more than to beat us to the finish line. What we experienced along the way was karts that hydroplaned along the straight, slipped and understeered in the corners, spun several times, bumped into tire walls, made and received contact with numerous other karts, transitioned from overlit straights into under-lit corners, squinted though fogged up helmet visors, and got colder and wetter than I think I have ever been in my life. Lots of layers helped, except with the hands and feet, which turn out to be pretty essential elements needed for kart control. Fortunately we had the NVCC canopy and a large propane heater which turned out to be more popular than the karts themselves. When it was all over and we were given our time sheets, it brought a little feeling back into our fingers and toes as we were able to come in fifth overall. Not bad considering the conditions.

Of course, we weren't the only ones getting cold and wet because the same wind and clouds were dumping on the folks at the annual Corvettes at Ocean City . NVCC was represented at the event by several hearty club members once again and also made a donation to the Free State Corvettes' benefit charity Spina Bifita.

At the October Council meeting, we talked about the drop off of rally events as well as cancellation of this year's Spooktacular and what it will take to put together several well-attended events in 2010. To help guide the club in this regard, a survey will be sent out to solicit member's opinions and ideas. Please watch for the survey and provide us with your feedback. We will use this information to help with upcoming decisions and planning for next years rallies and track/driving events.

The last Wednesday of October, and the evening after this month's GBM, is the Vienna Halloween parade. This is the 65th year for this local tradition and once again, NVCC will be a proud participant. GM's VP of Global Design Ed Welburn told *Inside Line* that the design of the new C7 Corvette will go retro much like the new Camaro and a prominent design feature will be the return of the split rear window. The next generation Corvette is expected to be launched in 2012 as a 2013 model.



The original split window appeared on the 1963 Corvette Coupe, but Chief Engineer Zora Arkus-Duntov hated the feature due to its limited visibility and in 1964 it was removed. Welburn addresses the visibility issue by saying "With the back-up cameras and blind-spot detection systems that we have these days, the visibility issue is much less of a problem."


The Corvette Stingray Concept that appeared in the latest Transformers movie also has a split rear window. "That car is not the next Corvette." says Welburn, "But the split-window is something that I expect for the next Corvette."

Welburn was the driving force behind the new reborn Camaro and is a big fan of the Corvette Stingray concept design as evidenced in this previously released Stingray Concept Introduction video.

As stated earlier, Inside Line says the C7 Corvette will have the traditional front-engine, rear drive layout. We'd love to see the C7 go a bit retro as long as its performance capabilities remain high.

National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary a Success Event attendance topped 24,000 over five days

Bowling Green, KY - Labor Day weekend 2009 saw one of the world's largest moving automotive events take place as Corvettes from all over the country participated in Caravan 09. As part of the 15th Anniversary and Grand Reopening of the National Corvette Museum, over 4,500 Corvettes came from all over the United States, Canada, Netherlands, the UK and Australia, got together in major cities as they grew in numbers and then converged on Bowling Green Kentucky.





facility, and hosted a five-day event that included a special exhibit of rare Corvettes, seminars with Corvette designers, engineers and experts, GM Assembly Plant tours, road trips, drag racing, autocross and a surprise appearance by the Stingray Corvette concept car that played the role of "Sideswipe" in the Paramount film Transformers 2: Revenge of the Fallen. Attendance over the five-day event exceeded 24,000, as visitors toured the new facility including the exhibit hall, library and archives, Corvette café and interactive exhibits.

Three 2010 Corvettes and \$15,000 in cash were raffled off and several cash drawings were held for those who pre-registered for the event. The annual membership meeting was held yielding great ideas and feedback for the Museum team, a special reception recognizing Lifetime Members took place after hours at the Museum and four Corvette elite were inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame at the annual dinner. News and developments of the planned NCM Motorsports Park were shared, and more details can be found on the new website at www.motorsportspark.org.

Museum Executive Director Wendell Strode commented afterward, "The tremendous success of this event says a lot about the love people have for – America's sports car, and for fellow car enthusiasts." The Museum welcomed 1,875 new members to the Corvette family during the event.

2010 Corvette Grand Sport LS3 Dry Sump Lubrication System



At the NCM Anniversary event, John Rydzewski, Assistant Chief Engineer for Small-Block Passenger Car Engines at GM takes an in-depth look at the 2010 Corvette Grand Sport's LS3 engine and dry sump lubrication system.

A little known fact is that the dry sump lubrication system only comes on the LS3 engines that go into the 2010 Grand Sport Corvette coupes equipped with a manual transmission. These engines are hand built and signed at the Wixom plant just like the LS7 and LS9 engines.

These engines do not come on Grand Sports with Automatic transmissions, nor do they come with the Grand Sport convertibles.


New Corvette Plant Manager Arrives

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. (AP) -- For Bob Parcell, working for General Motors is more than a job -- it's a family tradition.

Parcell's father worked for the automaker for 30 years and his uncle for 10 years. Parcell started working for GM as a co-op student in 1979 and now has a dream job -- working with Corvettes.

Parcell is the new plant manager of the General Motors Bowling Green Assembly Plant. He started the job this week, taking over for former manager Paul Graham, who was reassigned to a GM plant in Texas.



"It's the Corvette -- it's a dream vehicle for a lot of people," he said. "It lends itself to a certain buyer out there that's always going to be there." This is the eighth plant Parcell has worked at, but he's coming to Bowling Green in the midst of tough times for the auto industry. General Motors has struggled with financial problems this year, shuttering plants, laying off workers and filing for bankruptcy. The local plant has closed periodically over the past year, laid off employees and ended production of the Cadillac XLR.

And while some experts say the recession is tapering, high unemployment rates and poor consumer confidence continue to plague the economy.

"We still need to weather the storm a bit," Parcell said. "People are still a little tight with their purse strings."

Parcell said he plans to keep workers focused on what they can control: well-built, quality vehicles and plant safety.

"I'll spend a lot of time on the floor, one-on-one with the employees," he said. "Every place I've been, I put a little Bob Parcell spin (on it)." Parcell's top priority is safety at the plant. His second most important task is building quality vehicles: "That's what makes or breaks you," he said. He also plans to implement a few maintenance changes.

The Bowling Green plant is "a little long in the tooth. It's an older facility," he said. "There are some things we can do to brighten it up a bit, make it more of a morale booster." Some of those tasks include improving lighting and keeping equipment and materials in their proper places, he said.

And, if he has to announce further layoffs, he will deliver the news as soon as possible and be up front with his workers.

"The only way to deal with that kind of stuff is to be open and communicate with the people," he said.

As plant manager, Parcell's job is to help workers get the job done. He's in charge of grooming employees, finding and keeping good talent and making sure the plant produces high-quality vehicles. "How that happens on a day-to-day basis is different," Parcell said. "It's not a 9-to-5 job."




Parcell will be the sixth manager at the local plant, said Eldon Renaud, president of the local United Auto Workers union.

"I've worked with each one of them," he said. "Hopefully they can provide all the help from Detroit that we need to keep going even in tough times ... the most important thing is the working relationship with the people." A new plant manager is a big transition for some employees. Graham's departure surprised some workers, who were used to a longtime plant manager -- Graham's predecessor, Wil Cooksey, was plant manager for 14 years before retiring in 2008. "It's been a little more difficult because so many plant managers were moved this year," he said. "It wasn't one they moved ... they just moved (about) all within the system." This week, Parcell is meeting with the plant workers and getting familiar with the plant. He's also excited to meet dedicated Corvette customers, he said. At Cami, Parcell helped launch the redesigned Chevrolet Equinox and the GMC Terrain, cutting-edge SUVs that "dealers cannot keep in showrooms right now," he said.

Parcell said he hopes to interact with Corvette designers and relay customers' ideas to the design team.

"Five, 10 years from now, I think the Corvette will be the iconic vehicle it always has been," he said. "There's going to be a lot of pent up demand when things turn around."

Corvette Museum and Funfest Cruise 2009

Following a wonderful week at Atlantic Beach, North Carolina, in early September, for a much needed and appreciated break from the office, I had the opportunity to spend a week in my 2008 Jet Stream Blue Coupe cruising to Bowling Green, Kansas City, and Effingham, IL. The trip covered over 2700 miles averaging over 27 MPG with a 6-speed auto. Three tanks went over 29 MPG, so I cannot complain about mileage.

The remodeled Corvette Museum is so much better than it used to be. There is a Corvette Café that is even advertised on State roadside signs for the Museum exit. When you walk into the Museum you see a very tall open Corvette Nursery where they can display six Vettes waiting for new parents. The prep area runs along one entire back side of the building and can easily hold a dozen Vettes.



You exit the tour into the store which is expanded over its original size. It is so very easy to spend money in there!

The picture of the 1953 Corvette mosaic is remarkable because it is made up of thousands of 1 X 1 inch pictures that form the overall mosaic! The exterior design smoothly incorporates the old portions of the museum with the new and makes a striking picture. If you ever have the opportunity to stop by, do yourself a favor and spend time there.

This year's factor tour was very different from the one I took in 2008 when I picked up my Coupe. As soon as I pulled into the parking lot and saw the number of employee vehicles, I knew things were different. There are less than 600 employees left in the plant. The line produces just over 100 Corvettes a day. While I was on the tour, the line was made up of either black or silver Vettes, no other colors; the majority being the new Grand Sport models. When asked about only two colors on the line, the tour guide said that since the production numbers each day are so

low, they do batches of the same color so the paint booth process is more efficient. Several times during the tour we saw employees sitting down at their positions waiting for the next Vette to roll into place because the line was moving so slow. Sort of sad to see, but at least the line is still moving!

One point about the trip weather – it rained most of the week! In fact, driving through Nashville, I did less than 30 MPH with flashers on and an 18-wheeler sent a wave over the car that almost wrecked me! People are crazy in the rain!

Funfest was damp, but not a total wash out. I was there Friday afternoon and most of Saturday. I left at 3 PM and the thunderstorm hit with 2 inches of rain at 4 PM, but the show with Jan & Dean and the OC Beach Band and then Survivor went on that night. Mid America always puts on a great show and this year was no exception.



Funfest held a Corvette Auction for the first time with over 50 Vettes offered for sale. There were some very inexpensive cars (C3 & C4) that looked pretty good. The overall turn out appeared to be down from previous years, probably due to the economy and the weather. As you can see from the pictures, there were still some very interesting Vettes there and things to do (dyno,

burnout & sound-off contests, car show, exhaust install, brake system, and interior install). Chuck is a very gracious host. Funfest #35 was a success and this should be a future trip if you ever have the opportunity.
