

The more trained hands we have the easier it will be for NVCC to continue our Teen Driving School as a service to the community.

The NVCC Social Director, Laurie Kistner, has been busy coordinating our events calendar, which is filling up fast. While many events are recurring, many are also added as a result of individual member interest. I encourage our members to suggest events of interest to them, whether it is attending another organization's function as a group from our club, or initiating an event of our own. 2012 St. Patrick's Day Parade by John Palmgren


The 41st annual Washington D.C. St. Patrick's Day parade will be held on <u>Sunday March 11, 2012</u> at 12:00 noon and will proceed down Constitution Avenue from 7th to 17th Streets, N.W.

Key Rules are:

- Throwing candy or other objects from vehicles or floats along the parade route is prohibited. Any unit caught throwing objects to the spectators will be immediately removed from the parade. Walkers may hand candy or other novelty items to curbside spectators.
- Parade units should not stop and perform along the parade route. This disrupts the flow of the parade, resulting in gaps and delays. Parade units may perform for up to 30 seconds in front of the judge's and reviewing stands.

In years past, parade participants started lining up around 11 AM. I have not yet received official instructions of where in the staging area we will be lining up, but I'm guessing it will be the same as in previous years.

I recommend that we meet up around 10 AM in the Parking Lot on Army-Navy Drive, as in previous years, but depart for the parade route around 10:30 AM. The map below shows where we met up last year.



Legendary Chevrolet Corvette 427 Returns as Convertible for Anniversary Celebration

More than 40 years have passed since Chevrolet labeled a Corvette with a 427 badge. But beginning this summer for a limited run, the legendary nameplate will return on a convertible model commemorating the marque's 60th anniversary.

The car was unveiled to the public for the first time at the Barrett-Jackson auction in Scottsdale, Ariz., where the rights to purchase the first car with serial No. 001 were auctioned off. Proceeds from the sale will go toward the AARP's Drive to End Hunger charity, coordinated through Chevy dealer and NASCAR team owner Rick Hendrick.



The 2013 Corvette 427 Convertible Collector Edition will be the fastest and most capable convertible in Corvette's history, according to Corvette chief engineer Tadge Juechter. Along with the 427, Chevy will offer a 60th Anniversary Package available on all 2013 Corvette models.

The 427 convertible takes elements from both the Z06 and ZR1 models. The 427 is fitted with the LS7 engine from the Z06 that makes 505 hp and 470 lb-ft of torque, making it the most powerful engine ever put into a Vette convertible. Like the Z06, the 427 convertible is only available with a six-speed manual.

The Corvette 427 convertible will have the same driveline and rear-axle system from the Corvette Z06, a rear-mounted battery and standard Magnetic Selective Ride Control. The standard 19-inch front and 20-inch rear wheels are wrapped in ZR1-style Michelin PS2 tires. Lightweight machine-face Cup wheels--introduced on the 2012 Corvette Z06 with Z07 and Corvette ZR1 with PDE performance packages--come standard and include unique gray-painted pockets. Black Cup wheels or chrome ZR1-style wheels are also available.

The 427 convertible is fitted with several carbon-fiber components to help reduce weight, including a carbon-fiber raised hood (introduced on the 2011 Z06 Carbon Edition), carbon-fiber Z06-style fenders and carbon-fiber floor panels. "CFZ" carbon-fiber front splitter and rocker panels are optional on the 427 convertible and are included with the 60th-anniversary package.







Juechter said the 427 is also being used a bit as a test bed for some C7 Corvette technology, on which Chevy is using advanced composite materials to help reduce the weight of the car by some 40 pounds. It tips the scales at 3,555 pounds. Juechter said he wouldn't reveal which components have been modified but that the overall weight savings gives the 427 convertible a power-to-weight ratio of 6.64--in other words, 1 hp to every 6.64 pounds of vehicle weight. It should make the trip from 0 to 60 mph in 3.8 seconds, run a quarter-mile in 11.8 seconds and have a top speed of more than 190 mph. Lateral acceleration is 1.04 g.

The 427 convertible is available in 2LT, 3LT and 4LT trim levels and will carry a unique vehicle identification number sequence, similar to the Corvette ZR1. All 2013 Corvette models, including the 427 convertible, will be available with a 60th Anniversary Package, featuring an Arctic White exterior with a Blue Diamond leather-wrapped interior with suede accents.

Additional content includes a ZR1-style rear spoiler, gray-painted brake calipers and the "60th" logo on the wheel center caps, steering wheel and seat headrests. An optional graphics package adds full-length racing stripes in Pearl Silver Blue, including a tonal stripe stitched into the convertible top. For 2013, all Corvettes will feature 60th-anniversary badges on the fascias and the "waterfall" panel on convertible models, as well as 60th logos in the instrument-panel gauge cluster and on the sill plates.

The 2013 427 convertible is not being built in limited numbers; Juechter said they will build as many as they can sell. But it will be built only for the 2013 model year as the sixth generation of Corvettes wind down. Chevrolet officials have not said when the seventh-generation Vette will be launched, but Juechter said C6-model production will stop about a month before the C7 builds begin, giving the plant in Bowling Green, Ky., time to make the model switchover. Prices for the 427 convertible were not released, but sources expect the model to start at less than \$80,000.

Give 'em a BRAKE? By Cassidy Nolen

For our C5 family, this might save you some bucks....

Does your cruise control RANDOMLY cut out? If you have an automatic transmission, does your engine ever just shoot up a few hundred RPM driving down the highway? If so, your BRAKE SWITCH is out of adjustment!

Believe it or not, the brake switch that controls your brake lights ALSO controls the cruise control AND torque converter clutch in your Corvette! The system is backwards than what you might think. The brake pedal actually moves AWAY from the switch as you press the brakes, allowing the switch to make contact as you push the brakes away from it. Over time, the bushings in the brake pedal and the pedal height change, thereby letting intermittent brake switch contact to be made.

The solution? With a flashlight and 10 minutes, you can pull the lower plastic cover off under your dashboard. There you will find two round switches that simply "pop" closer to the pedal with some "encouragement". You can also disconnect the wires and turn them, as they thread into the assembly. With a little finesse, you can move them closer to the pedal and eliminate the transmission "searching" for a gear at highway speed and keep the cruise control on, even over the biggest of potholes!

There are detailed instructions on various Corvette websites, but this is a little known and quick fix for our cars.

NVCC FUNdraising ... by Bob Devery

I know that most of you attend the monthly meetings or one of the events that we do. So, you know that one topic that ALWAYS comes up is cashflow. The Club tries to do a lot of events for its members, but we never know whether we will have an adequate budget for it. Raising dues is never a topic that is popular. So, what do we do to maintain our existing programs and add others that Club members want? Many of you have heard my comments or seen my ad regarding FUNdraising for NVCC with a program that adds extra cash with NO work for NVCC and NO added cost to members or the Club. HOW can this be done?? Well, please read on:



- 1. Do you travel? Almost all members will respond: "YES"

- 3. When you book travel, do you look for the lowest price? Most will say: YES (a few will say: the itinerary; travel source; etc ... are more important)
- 4. When you complete the booking, does NVCC get cash from that booking? After a bewildered look, ALL of you will say: NO!!

Bottom line: most of you are booking travel NOW for summer and even into next year. What if I were to find the SAME travel at the SAME or lower price AND give a donation to the Club and a rebate to you? Remember: NO Internet source that you use ... NOT ONE ... is giving the Club one penny when you book your current travel. As a Club member, I know what the money means to NVCC's ability to do things. Thus, I'll give a donation on any travel; cruises; land tours; resort vacations ... all continents; major suppliers that are used by you now.

Here's the "worst case" scenario ... "Bob, I have a cruise; Disney trip; Vegas; Europe /Asia land tour; etc ... that costs \$XXX. What can you do?" Bob: "I can't beat it". You still go on your trip and have a great time. However, 90% of the time the reply will be: "I can match/beat that price. You'll get a rebate of \$X and NVCC will get a donation from me of equal value".

Folks, we've already broken the ice on this program with Stu & Carol Fox booking a cruise with me to save money AND get a check to NVCC ... which has already been cashed and deposited into the NVCC account! It'll happen EVERY time one of you book travel thru me. So, it boils down to this: book on your own, get the lowest price you can find and ZERO for NVCC ... **OR** book thru me; get the SAME OR LOWER price AND the donation to NVCC. Which one is better value for your money?

The benefit to NVCC will be several thousand dollars over the course of a year. So, you're going to travel. Here's all I ask: contact me before you book your travel and give me a few hours to check my suppliers for pricing. I handle ANY type of worldwide travel that you can get on the internet. And YES - I make money on what I do. So does ANY internet provider that you use. Here's the difference: I donate out of MY pocket to the Club. It's not Disney; Carnival; Mandalay Bay; Tauck Tours; Travelocity; Orbitz or any of 10,000 others who do it. It's MY donation to the Club because I'm at a point in life where I can do it to make a difference.

Also, I'd like to announce that I'm looking at planning a "First Annual NVCC FUNd Raising Cruise". I'll coordinate with Rich and Laurie to ensure that it meets their guidelines. I can do it in late summer 2012 after Carlisle; November 2012 (pre-Thanksgiving) or make it for late January before the Super Bowl to get away from the cold. It'd raise \$2000 - \$10,000 for NVCC depending on how many go. A group cruise of just 20 members will generate \$1500+. Add in a Mini Golf Tournament as I have on a group cruise in a few weeks and you add another \$500. A high school cruise

being planned for early summer 2013 for 100 alumni will give over \$10,000 to the school booster club! Since we can open the cruise to family & friends, getting 25-50+ people to go should be possible. I'd like ideas if you have them.

So, that's it ... travel, have fun, save money and help NVCC. All it takes is an email or call to me. All I promise is to do my best to make it work. bdevery@cruiseshipcenters.com
