c) As you pass the word, keep in mind a new rule – all students need to have a valid drivers license on the day of the event (learners permits are no longer accepted)



Grace's Engine Rebuild By Cassidy Nolen



After many years of reliable service, I decided to overhaul the LS1 in 'Grace', my 2000 Fixed Roof Coupe. While the idea of a crate LS2 or LS3 was tossed around, I really wanted to keep the original engine to the car (at least the block) and try to keep with the technology of the day. A newer motor would require some electrical modules to make the old computer talk to the new sensors and I don't like to have MORE potential for failure!

If you have ever built a motor, you know that the devil is in the details. Every component must be inspected, cleaned and prepared for installation. LS1 motors were developed to replace the aging small block Chevrolet engine that had powered the Corvette in one form or another since the mid 50's. The 'mouse motor' was

considered dated technology and there were many new advances in motor design and flow that made it hard to justify continuing the older style. 1997 saw more of a revolution than an evolution and the LS family of engines was born. Trucks, cars and SUV's would all see iterations of this motor and the current Corvette is the first in 16 years to NOT have an LS based engine.

Getting power on these motors is pretty simple. Big flow of air in and out and voila; you have power. The secret to longevity is

deciding ahead of time what your goals are and building to them. My FRC sees more high RPM's than the average motor so I decided to spring for some professional level parts and forged internal components. The stock pistons in the LS1 (and most other LS based motors) are cast hypereutectic pistons (an alloy of aluminum with a high silicon content) that do very well for general application. Under extreme conditions, they do tend to give up and it was just good insurance to spend the bucks to go with a forged set. While the connecting rods in a stock LS motor are very strong for their weight, the bolts are not. The stock GM hardware on the LS motor is called 'torque to yield', which means they stretch as you tighten them and you use that stretch to properly torque the bolt down until tight. While the rod bolts are just a standard torque setting, they have failed on enough motors to warrant replacement with a heavy duty set. I chose a set of H beam rods rather than the traditional I beam, ensuring no twist under heavy load.





Camshafts are the heart and soul of a motor. Every one is different and each one is a give and take of benefits. I decided to have a custom one ground, based on the Comp Cams XE lobe style. There wasn't a single offering that I could find that I liked and the few track-only camshafts that had good high end numbers would have made low speed driving impossible. Hopefully this was a good choice, as only time will tell.


Unlike the old small block days, the rocker arms are not adjustable on these LS motors. The

rockers are roller bearing mounted to bosses on the heads and do not have any adjustment. Therefore, if you make a change in the height of the rocker arm (for example you work the heads, change the gaskets, go with the LS6 hollow valves) you have to measure the new distance between the camshaft and the rocker arm, add the value of preload you wish to develop on the lifter and then order custom length

pushrods. This is an often overlooked step that can have serious consequences if done wrong.

Overall I would not say it was a difficult build, rather one that required a TON of reading. I found many of the parts that the Corvette community was charging

outrageous prices for could be found in the Firebird and Camaro community for much less (head bolts for example, same part number were almost \$50 cheaper from a Firebird website). Do your homework



know where to look! Feel free to ask me any questions and I'd be happy to direct you to a good source.

My highest compliments go to Simon at Tyson's Automotive Machine in Sterling for his exceptional machine work. He is a master and had reasonable prices for his exceptional work.





Third Corvette Emerges From Sinkhole

It's been almost three weeks since a 40' wide, 60' deep sinkhole opened up within the Skydome of the National Corvette Museum, taking eight prized Corvettes with it. Construction and engineering teams have been hard at work since day one, putting a plan in place for the recovery of the cars and restoration of the building.

The recovery of the three most accessible Corvettes: the 2009 "Blue Devil" ZR1, a 1993 40th Anniversary Ruby Red Corvette and a 1962 Black Corvette commenced on Tuesday with all three cars being successfully saved. Monday's "Operation Corvette

Plus" resulted in the recovery of the 2009 and the 1993 and nearly all day Tuesday was dedicated to the 1962 - a car that was recovered around 1:45pm CT giving spectators watching from the Museum's plexiglass viewing area and the construction and engineering crews a huge sigh of relief.

The team began work early Tuesday, extracting a portion of the car lift that had become mangled around the car, removing the hood from the '62 and tying a strap to the engine bay, then drilling anchors into the slab of concrete that appeared to be wedged into the grill. In hooking their lifting devices to the car they discovered that they didn't have to lift the slab to free the car. "Really, all that went better than I expected... that's my favorite car," said Mike Murphy, CEO of Scott, Murphy and Daniel Construction.

"I see body damage. The chassis looks intact, the frame's not bent, the interior (other than being a little dirty) is pristine. So, I think it's some fiberglass work, some ornamentation work, and paint," said John Spencer, Manufacturing Integration Manager at the GM Corvette Assembly Plant. "This car is in amazing shape considering what it's been through. I don't see anything unrepairable."

Murphy indicated that the next step will be to remove the concrete slab off the bank of the hole, and to remove the rest of the car lift. After those are out of the way they will begin stabilizing and securing the red spire and the walls of the hole. "I'm tickled to death that we were able to get those three cars out with no problems, and they were in good condition," he added.

All three cars are now on display in the Museum's Exhibit Hall. They will be joined in late April by the remaining five Corvettes - marking a culmination of the sinkhole recovery efforts. The Museum is planning a formal exhibit of these cars "as is," along with various photos, videos, information and artifacts through August 3. The plexiglass viewing area of the Skydome will be available as long as construction is on-going, and the 'dome' is expected to re-open by late August.



"While we don't know exactly how long the repair and remediation of the sinkhole will take, we feel confident that the Skydome will be as good as new in time for the Museum's 20th Anniversary Celebration," said Executive Director Wendell Strode. "August 27-30 of this year will be an exciting time in Bowling Green, Kentucky as we will have over 10,000 Corvette enthusiasts caravaning from all over the country to celebrate the Museum, the Grand Opening of our Motorsports Park, and now the re-opening of our Skydome."

NCRS and NCCC Donate to Museum

Support for our sinkhole relief has come from not just individuals, but from organizations. Two such organizations are the National Corvette Restorers Society and National Council of Corvette Clubs.

Museum staffer Gary Cockriel attended a number of NCCC meetings in February, including a meeting of the Governors in St. Louis. At the meeting, Hal Bellamy, President of NCCC and the NCCC representative on the Museum's board, suggested the group donate to aid in the sinkhole relief. After a nearly unanimous vote the Governors presented Gary with a check for \$5,000.

The NCRS has also donated \$5,000 - but has issued a challenge to their 46 chapters worldwide. They have pledge to match the contributions of their chapters, up to \$5,000 additional dollars - bringing the potential grand total to \$15,000 or higher.

Thanks so much to these two groups for their contributions! Check back next week as we feature even more folks that have been helping with contributions!

Triple-Digit Sales Growth – Floodgates open for new-gen Corvette

When General Motors released their latest sales numbers for February 2014, proof that the new C7 Corvette was hitting the sweet spot was easy to see.

While several of the General's brands were listed among those enjoying increased sales, it was deliveries of the all-new Corvette Stingray that stole the show with increases of 149% over last year's numbers.

The Bowling Green, KY plant has been turning out the new Stingrays since mid-September 2013 and after a few months of trying to keep up with demand for the new model, sales numbers are still strong. The year-to-date numbers for the new Corvette Stingray remain at levels not seen since 2006. January-February 2014 sales for Corvette total out to 4,699, compared to only 1,888 units by this time last year. Month-specific sales for 2014 are 2,438 for February and January's numbers filling out the remaining 2,261 cars. Last year, the numbers-per-month were 980 in February and 908 in the first month of 2013.

What is a Teen Driving School ?

The Northern Virginia Corvette Club's Teen Driving School is a whole day of excitement that provides young adults with hands on, real world driving experiences within the safety of a closed course environment.

Our highly experienced instructors ride with each student and a parent *in your car* to provide one-on-one instruction for specific car control exercises. This individualized coaching allows students to learn at their own pace and drive within their comfort level. There is no charge for this event.

Why we do this?

Inexperience is the number one cause of auto accidents in young adults. The following exercises are conducted to provide car control experience that is directly transferrable to everyday driving.

CLASSROOM

Short presentations – Car dynamics, correct seating positions, typical distractions, plus an overview of the day's activities

THRESHOLD BRAKING

Students are taught proper techniques of car control while braking in a straight line and while the car is in a turn.

SLALOM

Medium speed serpentine course through safety pylons laid out to highlight car control methods, eye - hand movements, "ocular driving skills" and car control in reverse.

SKID PAD

A wet, slippery circular course used to educate students on loss of traction and demonstrate front and rear skid recovery techniques.

CAR CARE

Basic identification of the dip stick, where to add oil, how to check radiator caps, windshield washer fluid levels, brake and power steering reservoirs. Includes discussion of v-belts vs serpentine belts, tire inflation, brake pads, what a car jack looks like, and an important exercise for properly setting side and rearview mirrors.

PARTICIPANT REQUIREMENTS: What you need to know to participate

- NO trucks, vans, or SUVs of any type. Due to our insurance policy we CAN NOT allow these.
- NO "walk on" registrations; you must be registered in advance. Seating is limited!
- Students MUST possess a valid driver's license.
- At least ONE parent or guardian MUST stay, attend classroom sessions, and ride with their young adult driver.
- Please be on time; those who are late will NOT be able to participate.
- Sorry, but only the student and parent(s) or documented 'guardians' are invited. No others are allowed in due to our host's rules. Sadly no siblings, friends, etc. This is a requirement passed down from our host.
- No pets are allowed.
- This event runs RAIN or SHINE, please make sure to show up regardless of weather and dress accordingly !
- Make certain that you have a full tank of gas and check tires for proper inflation prior to the event.
- Remove all loose items from the vehicle prior to arrival, including items in the trunk. There is limited space to store your items on site, so please leave them at home. Spare tire and related equipment are OK. Loose bowling balls, wedding cakes, or Tiffany chandeliers will not fair well in your car.
