CAR CONTROL CLINIC – SUMMIT POINT – SEPTEMBER 20, 2015

We had a very successful event Sept 20, 2015. We had 16 participants and about as many event staff supporting us.

We provided 3 skill stations in the morning.

- -Skid Pad
- -Slalom course
- -Threshold braking

In the afternoon, the participants were introduced to the skills and techniques required for high performance driving by their coaches on the Jefferson course.

The analysis of the participant surveys indicate that everyone had a great time. On a scale of 1-5 with 5 being the highest, the averages from all of the participants for the event, was 4.6, the same average as last year.

We have a little work to do with one or two items for next year: getting started on time in the morning, consistent instructor approaches, etc.

We have some decisions to make for next year about site selection, event budgets, and perhaps soliciting some sponsors. The end result is what matters. We had 16 participants that left with smiles and a new set of skills.





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MICHELIN STREET SURVIVAL TIRE SCHOOL 101

TIRE RACK STREET SURVIVAL TIRE SCHOOL, SEPTEMBER 10-11TH

A mass email was sent out to the hosts of last season's TRSS events. The first 20 or so that replied, had the opportunity to attend this event at Greenville, South Carolina. Michelin is one of the major supporters of the TRSS program. I think I was one of the first to reply "YES".

Michelin was a great host. They took care of trip planning logistics and reservations, the first class hotel, the Hyatt Regency, all of the meals including group suppers at excellent restaurants. There were 20 of us including the National Program Manager for the TRSS program and members from the BMW Foundation.

We were not permitted to take pictures at the plant or test track at any time... sadly.

Day 1 – Tire Purchase Experience

Classroom instruction/ presentation and discussions

- tire safety
- markings
- replacement and service
- review key product technologies and the benefits they produce.

Afternoon:

Tour of the manufacturing facility, US1, to experience how a tire is made.

This one plant makes over 1,000 tires per hour – 24 hours per day (24,000+ tires each day). We were given noise cancelling head phones to hear the tour guide. He had worked their over 30 years. It was an amazing tour. We saw how the raw materials entered the plant, were mixed in different combinations and put on large rolls and transported to the production lines.

- Each tire is built up from several different layers using materials from the different rolls.
- The rolls are sequenced along the production line.
- The tires are built on a round carriage that stops at different stations, they spin as the material
 from each roll is applied then cut off. There are many carriages traveling the production line all
 the time. And of course, there are multiple production lines.
- The carriages stop at several different stations on the production line, one for each new layer. At each station, another layer is applied and so forth.

The "raw" tire is removed from the carriage and transported to the molding machine. The raw tire is placed in the mold. The high heat and pressure from the mold, cures the different layers and molds in the tread pattern. Each tire is left in the mold for a short time.

After the tire is completed, EACH tire in manually inspected for blemishes, etc. EVERY tire

After the visual inspection, EVERY tire is inspected at a computerized station. It is mounted on a "wheel" and spun up to speed against a large rolling surface. The tire is tested for pulling left or right, a transducer measures the sound frequency, measurements are taken of the side wall flex, etc.

Tires are then sent on to the warehouse... which can hold 800,000 tires. Note that Michelin is the only tire company to visually and automatically test 100% of their tires. This was a VERY impressive tour.

Day 2 was spent at their test track... 30+ miles of different tracks.

Multiple driving exercises on dry and wet surfaces to test the capabilities and limitations of Michelin tires

Exercise 1: Driving new Sahara Jeeps through the woods and mud bogs to demonstrate the new AT BF Goodrich (yes, they own the brand) tires. Nothing phased these tires. You could crawl through the mud holes as slow as you wanted. You didn't need momentum to get through them. This was fun and of course I now need a Jeep (again).

Exercise 2: Toyota MiniVan on four HALF TREAD depth Michelin Premier A/S tires vs. a new BMW 328 on brand new full tread competitor tires – around a sprinkler-ed course, with left and right turs.

Results: The Toyota MiniVan was more stable and FASTER than the BMW even on half tread tires. The BMW would spin out with little warning. We never felt comfortable in it.

Exercise 3: Braking Test – sprinkler-ed test section

The Camrys were instrumented to measure the distance covered for each braking test.

The cars again had half tread depth Michelin tires vs. full tread depth tires from a different brand.

The half tread Michelin tires stopping distance was 20 - 30 feet shorter than the competitor. This new Michelin tire exposes new grooves as it wears down. This was a challenging technology to move to production. Again, as the tire wears down, more rain grooves are exposed.

Exercise 4: Placement of 2 new tires – Do you put them on the front – or – rear?

We drove two new Camrys back to back around a half mile diameter sprinkler-ed track.

The first car we drove had 2 tires half tread depth on the front and 2 full tread tires ON THE REAR. This car was easy to control at 40 mph. The front tires would lose grip and you simply let up on the gas to regain control.

The 2nd car, had the 2 full tread tires ON THE FRONT and the <u>2 half tread tires on the rear</u>. As we approached the same speed as before, the back end would suddenly over steer and skid out causing spins and lots of drama.

Results: Put the newest tires on the back. If you need snow traction, do it right and buy 4 new tires.

Note: There were 9 people on my team. 7 drivers spun so badly driving the 2nd car, they stopped sideways or facing backwards. The other two drivers recovered from their spins and were able to keep going. Yes, I was one of them!!

I am not naming names, but the most spectacular set of spins was performed by the head of the TRSS program who was greeted with a round a loud applause when he came back in. He got the most style points.

We ended the day with hot Laps with test track driver in a 2010 Mustang GT with Michelin Pilot Super Sport tires, the same as I use on my Corvette. Since I drive a Corvette, this part of the day was... Ok. I have an extra 136 horse power, what can I say?

I had the chance to meet 20 very dedicated teen driving instructors. A lot of them travel and teach several times each season.

I was able to introduce them to Paul's car care station and many were very interested. Paul gave me a photo that I forwarded to them. I have an action item to provide them a written list of the item used and a short bulleted list of how we deliver the information, including showing the students how to check fluids and spare tire locations.

This was a very interesting trip!



NVCC General Business Meeting Minutes

September 22, 2015

Officers present:

John Palmgren, President Dave Dubois, Chief Instructor Marsha Batchellor, Treasurer Sean Waddell, Social Chair/OAL Vicki Allen-Scott, Secretary

The meeting was called to order at 7:38pm by John Palmgren, in the garage area of Page Chevrolet, 6500 Little River Turnpike, Alexandria, VA 22312.

The first order of business was a recap of NVCC's Car Control Clinic (C3) which took place on September 20th. The main area for improvement was a delayed start at the tech portion of the program. Overall, the event was well received and compares favorably with last year; however, with only 15-16 attendees, NVCC lost money (spent \$5,000 and made \$3,000). Dave pointed out that they were able to run shifts on-schedule, even with a severe shortage of staff and instructors. In addition, Mr. Paul Quattrociocchi made a donation of \$100, upon learning that NVCC was in the red on this event. The NVCC council will follow up with a thank you note.

For next year, Dave suggested that NVCC:

- 1) Hold a separate meeting prior to the event;
- 2) Try to attract more sponsors to defray costs;
- 3) Consider holding event earlier in year, for better attendance.

Corvettes Care – NVCC Car Show (Oct 4th)

Dave Dubois reported that there are 6 registrations so far, and we need to do a better job of publicizing the show. He reminded us that pre-registered (online) entrants (\$35) will receive a printed, personalized sign for their vehicle. Gate entrants (\$40) will receive a hand written sign. Dave asked for volunteers, in particular, data entry assistants to register entrants. He estimates that 7-8 people will be needed, and asked that volunteers bring a laptop (equipped with Excel).

Other details discussed about the car show included:

- The show will feature seven (7) NCCC-sanctioned events, with handsome trophies to winners.
- Workers will receive 3 (NVCC) points, and the show chair will receive 9 points.
- Workers are needed to sell shirts, staff the gate, setup, and cleanup. Volunteers may register via the show's website (www.motorsportreg.com), and should alert Kris re availability.
- This is a 'rain or shine' event and covered parking will be available for C1 and C2 vehicles.

- There will be a 50/50 drawing, a raffle with prizes, a DJ, food trucks, and post-market vendors.

Vienna Halloween Parade (Wednesday preceding Halloween –Oct 28)

John P. reminded the group about NVCC's participation in the annual Vienna Halloween Parade, and encouraged new members to join in.

Corvettes on the Boardwalk (Oct 16-17)

John P. reminded the group about this weekend event that is sponsored by Freestate Corvette Club (Maryland). Several NVCC members are registered to participate, including him and his wife Kara, Jerry and Irene Lelanski, John and Vicki Scott, and Paul and Lori Benish.

Cruising Suggestions

Sean W. asked who would be interested in cruising to the Shady Maples restaurant/buffet in Intercourse, PA – perhaps on a Saturday in late October.

Later in the meeting, Sean announced that Mike Gilliland is considering a cruise next year to Indianapolis, IN – with the goal of participants being able to put wheels on the track for a lap or two. A visit to the Air Force Museum in Dayton, OH may be a stop along the way.

Teen Driving School (11/7-11/8)

Dave announced that volunteers are urgently needed to make this a successful event (picking up cones, etc.) Instructors are also needed and this is a good opportunity to learn how to instruct in any of three areas (skid pad/cones/braking). Volunteers and participants can sign up on the motorsports.com website. As of today, there are 7 students enrolled for the NVCC portion (Sunday, 11/8), and 13 students enrolled for the BMW portion (Saturday, 11/7).

At the close of the discussion, Dave briefed everyone about his attendance at the tour of the Michelin tire plant in Ohio (via TireRack's invitation). It was an expenses-paid trip, informative and interesting, and a generous gesture by Michelin. His point was tied to the fact that TireRack and Michelin are sponsors of the Teen Driving School event.

The Northern Virginia Corvette Club's TRSS event is a whole day of excitement that provides young adults with hands on, real world driving experiences within the safety of a closed course environment.

Our highly experienced instructors ride with each student and a parent in your car to provide one-on-one instruction for specific car control exercises. This individualized coaching allows students to learn at their own pace and drive within their comfort level. There is no charge for this event.

Why we do this?

Inexperience is the number one cause of auto accidents in young adults. The following exercises are conducted to provide car control experience that is directly transferrable to everyday driving.

CLASSROOM

Short presentations – Car dynamics, correct seating positions, typical distractions, plus an overview of the day's activities

THRESHOLD BRAKING

Students are taught proper techniques of car control while braking in a straight line and while the car is in a turn.

SLALOM

Medium speed serpentine course through safety pylons laid out to highlight car control methods, eye - hand movements, "ocular driving skills" and car control in reverse.

SKID PAD

A wet, slippery circular course used to educate students on loss of traction and demonstrate front and rear skid recovery techniques.

CAR CARE

Basic identification of the dip stick, where to add oil, how to check radiator caps, windshield washer fluid levels, brake and power steering reservoirs. Includes discussion of v-belts vs serpentine belts, tire inflation, brake pads, what a car jack looks like, and an important exercise for properly setting side and rearview mirrors.

PARTICIPANT REQUIREMENTS: What you need to know to participate


- At least ONE parent or guardian MUST stay, attend classroom sessions, and ride with their young adult driver.
- Please be on time; those who are late will NOT be able to participate.
- Sorry, but only the student and parent(s) or documented 'guardians' are invited. No others are allowed in due to our host's rules. Sadly no siblings, friends, etc. This is a requirement passed down from our host.
- No pets are allowed.
- This event runs RAIN or SHINE, please make sure to show up regardless of weather and dress accordingly!
- Make certain that you have a full tank of gas and check tires for proper inflation prior to the event.
- Remove all loose items from the vehicle prior to arrival, including items in the trunk. There is limited space to store
 your items on site, so please leave them at home. Spare tire and related equipment are OK. Loose bowling balls,
 wedding cakes, or Tiffany chandeliers will not fair well in your car.
