<u>VETT-ING THE AMERICAN DREAM</u> By Virginia D'Antonio

As some of you may know, I am working on my PhD in Sociology and my dissertation topic is Corvette car culture. The focus of my study evaluates the symbolic meaning of the car as it embodies history, aspirations of success, freedom, and American values for both Corvette

owners and Corvette admirers alike. With careful scrutiny, the Corvette is found to be a sacred object in the lives of owners that is reaffirmed through rituals such as car shows, conventions, cruises, and club membership. Often, personal relationships form around the car where common interests and values emerge, leaving the person more closely connected to others because of their passion for the mystique of this sports car.

The relationships that form around the car are an integral part of my research. I am interested in the social capital that is built through ownership of this vehicle and the communities that are constructed surrounding this brand. While our society has changed greatly over the last sixty years, including less voluntary associations, fewer close bonds with neighbors, and a reduction in civic participation, the Corvette has provided continuity for consumers and an opportunity for renewed civic engagement.

So, I have been collecting data on Corvette owners for a little over a year now. I have conducted in depth personal interviews, and also surveys of Corvette club members across the country. Meeting Corvette owners from all over the country, I am finding their stories to be somewhat similar in that most had a fascination with the Corvette from early childhood or youth experience that stayed with them their whole life until they bought one as adults.

I am using both nostalgia and patriotism as variables to be measured among Corvette owners to see how powerful these sentiments are among the car owners. I am finding that most Corvette owners have owned multiple Vettes throughout their adult lives. In addition to interviews and surveys, I am using participant observation methods including car rallyes, car cruises, car shows, car clinics, and Corvette gatherings. I also participated in the American flag formation at Corvettes at Carlisle last August with my white Corvette convertible. I rented a 2015 Stingray to drive to Bowling Green, Kentucky and even met Chip Foose from Overhaulin! Often, this is too much fun to even be research.

Currently, I am in the middle of data collection with over 200 survey respondents and 20 interviews so far. I will be traveling for the summer to meet other Corvette owners and clubs and will begin writing my final product in the fall. I look forward to sharing my findings with NVCC once data collection is complete. I am thankful to all of the members who have participated in my survey. If you are new to the club, or didn't get a chance to take the survey, I have provided the link below. It takes around four minutes to complete, and is very helpful to my research. Feel free to let me know if you have any Corvette stories you would like to share with me that I may include in my research. I welcome all contributions!

THE WASHINGTON AUTO SHOW BY: PAUL BENISH

This year, even though there weren't a lot of Corvettes to be had, there was definitely more to see and do than other years. There was the usual Jeep off-road experience, which is fun if you haven't ever done it before. There was also the usual hands-on contest and "intelligent transport superhighway", which is



basically another way of saying alternative fuel vehicles. They did have a lot of interesting vehicles in that area other than the usual solar car or natural gas car. There was a full size double-long metro bus that runs on natural gas as well as some autonomous vehicles. Ironically, leading those vehicles on a parade from the capitol earlier that week was a 1915 model T that was on display at the entrance of the show. All of the manufacturers really stepped it up with their various displays and demonstrations as well. There was a cutout of the Honda fuel cell motor as well as multiple displays on car tech and upcoming prototypes. One of the vehicles which was alitzed up for the event was the Toyota Mirai masquerading as today's back to the future car complete with gullwing doors, light tunnel looking wheels, and a Mr. Fusion! Of course, there was a couple of Corvette ZO6s and Corvette Stingrays there as well. Even after being out for two years, there was still a crowd waiting to sit in them.
