TRIVIA By John Scott

- Q1. (For those who've been members for less than two years.) From 1963, when the Corvette was badged as the "Sting Ray" (two words), to 1977, when the "Stingray" (one word) badge was removed (not to reappear until the C-7), one model year did not use the Stingray name. Which year was the Corvette not a Stingray?
- A1. The 1968 Corvette did not use the "Stingray" name.
- Q2. (For Rick Poage) The order guide for the 1970 Corvette lists an LS7 engine option, rated at 460 horsepower and costing \$3,000, available with both a manual and automatic transmission option. How many LS7-equipped 1970 Corvettes were sold?
- A2. There is no record of any retail sale of the LS7 option before the offering was cancelled.
- Q3. The United States celebrated its 200th birthday in 1976. The 1976 Corvette featured three elements which were less worthy of celebration. What were they? (Will accept any two.)
- A3. -- The 1976 edition was the first Corvette model since the car was introduced in 1953 that did not offer a convertible model for sale. A convertible option would not reappear until 1986.

-- The 1976 Corvette offered a new "sport" steering wheel, the same steering wheel as that offered in the 1976 Chevrolet Vega.

-- California buyers in 1976 could not opt for the 210 horsepower L82 engine; their only option was the 180 horsepower L48 version. (It would only get worse for California Corvette fans; in 1980 their only engine option was the 305 ci LG4 with an automatic transmission.)

Q4. In 1966, the Rolling Stones had a massive hit titled "Paint It Black". A few years later, if Mick Jagger or Keith Richards had walked into their local Chevrolet dealer to buy a Corvette, and told Chevrolet to "paint it black," they'd have been disappointed. During which years could you not get a black Corvette delivered from the factory?

A4. From 1970 to 1976, no Corvettes were painted black at the factory.


