with an even greater appreciation for them.

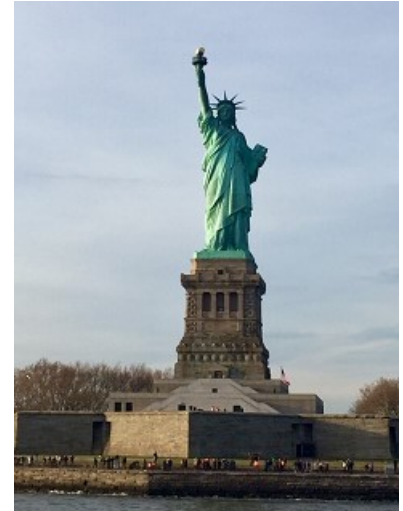
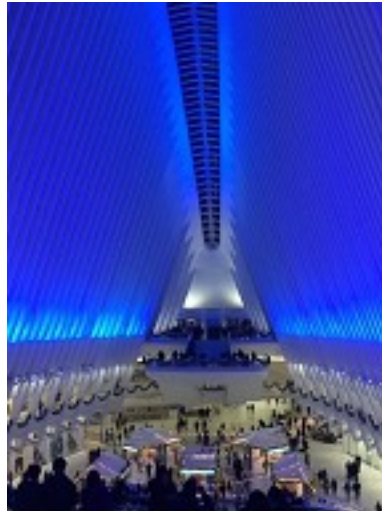

Most Festive- Team Shoemaker

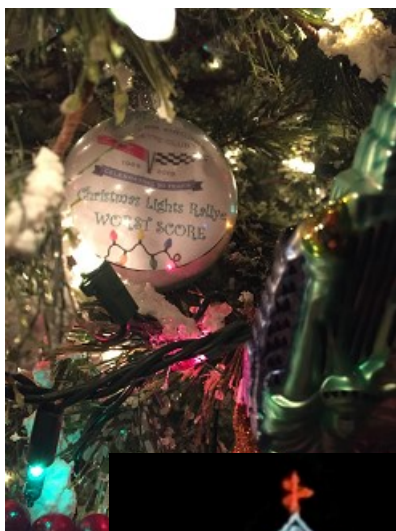
