





SERVICE ISSUES: COMMONTHEMES

Fellow club members, I noticed a common theme with service "issues" when someone brings in their car for work, so I offer the following suggestions.

We all care about our cars and want them properly serviced. There are a several things you need to do before, and after, you bring your car in for service. Start by documenting the problem, then research to see if this is a common problem. Wash your car before dropping it off. Always be polite when you make the appointment, be polite when you drop it off, and be reasonable on the timeframe for the repair, and if you have any problems talk with the service manager or general manager. If that fails, contact the automotive customer service number.

Document what your car is doing, or not doing, as best you can. Does it happen under acceleration, deceleration, turning left or right, low speed, high speed, going uphill, when accessories are on, etc. Check the applicable auto forums to see if others have the same problem and what they did to fix it. Here are a few Corvette specific sites: https://www.corvetteforum.com, https://www.corvetteforum.com, https://www.smokinvette.com/corvetteforum/.

Also, check the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) at https://www.nhtsa.gov/recalls and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) https://www.nhtsa.gov/recalls for safety, Technical Service Bulletins (TSB), or recalls.

Wash & vacuum your before dropping it off for service. Also, open the hood and do a little sprucing up, at least get out the leaves, pine needles, and clumps of pollen. This may seem minor, but no one wants to work on a dirty automobile! Back in the day, my dad was a Service Advisor and he told me if someone doesn't care about their car, the mechanic won't, either. My next-door neighbor owns a foreign service auto shop and says the same thing. When we had a Volvo and he worked on it, he explained to his mechanics that they can tell I care about my car and that they need to respect it. When my C5 had a minor leak coming from the harmonic balancer, John (Page Corvette mechanic) noticed how clean my car and especially the engine bay, and after he finished the repairs, he cleaned the fluid off the underside of the car. Now, that's service and I thanked him for being so caring.

Make the service appointment and calmly explain the situation when you talk with the Service Advi-



sor. Also, be reasonable on how long the service may take. If you're in a rush, explain that you need it soon; if it's a true emergency they'll understand. Whenever possible, I give them as much time as they need. Remember the old saying: "if you want it bad, you'll get it bad".

When you arrive and talk with the Service Advisor, be polite and, again calmly explain the issue and give them any of your documentation on the issue. Too many times when I when I drop off any of my cars for service, people are yelling at the service writer in person or on the phone. That gets you nowhere. Think of it another way - would you yell at your waiter/waitress or the chef before your food is served to you? Not if you don't want a "foreign object" in your meal! Would you want someone getting angry at you for something you didn't do, but you were trying to help them? Also, for our Corvettes, let the Page Service Advisor know you're a member of the Northern Virginia Corvette Club. Show our club magnetic name tag for the discount; they don't know everyone on sight and/or don't always see the club decal on your car. If you have any issues with membership discounts, please see Vince. Also, if you have an extended warranty, give them the warranty number and a copy of the extended warranty for their records.

When you pick up your car, thank them and enjoy your ride.

However, if there is a problem that you can't resolve, ask to talk with the Service Manager. Don't walk out in a huff as the problem won't get resolved. Talk with the Service Manager and calmly explain what happened and what you expect. Don't be dramatic or demanding. Remember, the Service Manager can't fix any problems/resolve issues / improve training if he/she doesn't know about the problems. If still not resolved, ask to speak with the General Manager and again, be polite. As with the Service Manager, the General Manager can't address issues if he/she is unaware of the issues. If still not resolved, call and talk with the auto manufacture's Customer Service. Notice that I wrote "talk with" and not "talk to"; with my 30 plus years in government Information Technology, I know what it feels like to be "talked to" versus someone "talk with me" on a computer related problem.
