Directions (total driving time: 45 min.):

- 1) Turn right onto Georgetown Pike (193), heading toward McLean
- After mile, Turn right onto Leigh Mill Road (683), proceed slowly thru 2 one-lane bridges
- At 3-way Stop, Turn left onto Towlston Road (676)
- At Stop, Turn right onto Old Dominion Drive (738)
- After mile, Turn left onto Kimberwick Road; Proceed slowly over a speed hump
- At Stop, Turn left onto Georgetown Pike (193) toward Great Falls
- Turn right at second light intersection onto River Bend Road (603)
- 8) Turn Left onto Beach Mill road (603)
- 9) At 3-way Stop, Turn right onto Walker Road (681), then left onto Beach Mill Road
- 10) At 3-way Stop, Turn right across L'Auberge Chez Francois, then left onto Beach Mill Road
- Turn left onto Seneca Road (602)
- 12) Turn left onto Georgetown Pike (193) back toward Great Falls
- Turn right onto Springvale Road (674) [or option: Go straight back to Old Brogue Pub]
- 14) Turn left onto Brevity Road, the left onto Challedon Road, then right onto Shesue Street
- 15) At Stop, Turn right onto Harriman Street
- 16) At Stop, Turn left onto Walker Road (681), heading back to Old Brogue Pub
- 17) Turn left into Walker Village parking lot, and drive counter-clock wise around the lot
- 18) Arrive at Great Falls Creamery, behind Old Brogue Pub

Mark your calendars for Friday and Saturday, April 30-May 1, 2021. The OBX Rod & Custom show is a must see for classic car and Corvette enthusiasts. As with 2020, COVID-19 will impact the events and venue(s). A detailed schedule will not be available until February. The "normal" format is a central venue with live band and food trucks at Festival Park in Nags Head on the sound with cruises to multiple restaurants and commercial sites up and down the beach in order to "get your tickets punched" to be eligible for a prize. There was also an evening cruise into Manteo where folks parked and went to multiple restaurants. Great venue for pictures.

This year, the Governor would not allow the central site, so 17 venues were chosen that all participants could cruise into over the two days. This year's activities appear below to give you a flavor of what is to come. Over 400 vehicles participated from all over the eastern seaboard, including at least two dozen Corvettes of which at least 5 were C8s:

- Wednesday night Drag racing at OBX speedway (1.5 hrs. west on mainland) \$15, drive in and race to
 your heart's content
- Thursday night 6PM-8PM informal welcome at Richard Quigly's (charity organizer) American Classic Garage
- Friday-Saturday 11 AM-5PM cruising the 17 venues (restaurants and shops)
- Friday night unsanctioned meets at several large venues, one in Manteo with a live band

2021 will have an additional exciting event the <u>weekend before</u> OBX R&C. On April 24, Gary Knapp of "Gravedigger" fame will host a cruise to his Monster Truck facility a few miles north of OBX on Rt. 158.

For those who have never done this, folks come from as far away as the Gulf coast and the Northeast, many trailering their cars to the beach. They rent houses from various rental companies (now COVID prepped), or stay in one of many hotels from the lowest to highest price ranges. Many stay for a week and, given the spring timing, rates and weather should be good for outdoor dining and touring.

More information will be provided as it become available. We hope to see many more Vettes this year!





CORVETTE ACRONYM CONFUSION





Recently I listened to an environmental geology webinar featuring NVCC's very own Kris McCandless. The presentation was full of geologic and environmental technical terms and had its own set of tricky acronyms. The only thing I really understand was the introduction..."Good Afternoon, I'm Kris McCandless." His professionalism is unquestionable as we've all experienced his "Geologic Minute" on Corvette Cruises.

Now let's tackle those corvette acronyms.

2LT - Corvette Trim Package (1LT, 2LT, 3LT)

LT2 - Name of the C8's engine (LT1 is the name of the C7's engine) MRC - Magnetic Ride Control MagneRide - Short name for Magnetic Ride Control

A8 - Eight-Speed Transmission

M7 - Seven-Speed Manual Transmission

NVCC - Northern Virginia Corvette Club

NCCC - National Council of Corvette Clubs (includes about 250 Clubs in 16 Regions with more than 19,000 Members) NCM - National Corvette Museum NCRS - National Corvette Restorers Society BGAP - Bowling Green Assembly Plant

You're probably asking yourself where this is going. There has been some confusion between NVCC, NCCC, and NCM memberships. NVCC requires NCCC membership, about a third of your annual membership dues goes to NCCC. NCM is a separate membership as well as NCRS is a separate membership. All four mentioned organizations focus on the enjoyment of America's Sports Car...the Corvette.

I highly recommend becoming a member of the National Corvette Museum (NCM). This organization is the guardian of all things Corvette; past, present, and future.


