After Seneca Rocks was the best leg of our tour, Rt 33 to Harrisonburg. It's a beautiful country drive mixed with the




best mountain twisties.





He later went on to work on the design of a car referred to as Germany's Corvette. This car featured an all aluminum V8 and aft mounted transmission, just like a C5, by way earlier.
