
AMERICAN LEGION DOUG WILSON SCENIC MEMORIAL RIDE JUNE 26, 2022






NVCC members are encouraged to attend this show benefitting our veterans. There is no cruise associated with this event...all you have to do is show up and show your club "colors."


Last year, Wayne Carini, of "Chasing Classic Cars" showed up with his family...a treat for all. No telling who will be there this year.

- All show vehicles will be classed as Stock, Modified, or Post 1997 upon arrival by Bull Run Region and decisions are final.
- Stock vehicles, Class A, must reflect equipment available for the year and model vehicle except for minor upgrades and safety modifications.
- Modified vehicles, Class B, must be 25 years old or older based on the vehicle's state registration.
- Post 1997 vehicles, whether stock or modified, are in Class C
- Vehicles may be displayed as the owner wishes within the space allotted and must not interfere with other participants or the flow of traffic. Hoods must be open for best of show judging.
- All vehicles must have a fire extinguisher.
- Vehicles must be driven onto the show field under their own power.
- Once parked, vehicles must remain turned off until the meet is over at approximately 3:00 pm.
- Vehicles needing to exit earlier must be escorted off the field.
 Contact a Bull Run member to arrange escort.
- Cars with "For Sale" and/or "Raffle" signs must be in the Car Correl and registered for the show as such.
- · Results of the vote tally are final.
- No alcoholic beverages are permitted.
- No food sales unless authorized in advance by Bull Run Region.
- Pre-registration fees are non-refundable except for show cancellation by Bull Run Region.

From I-95: Travel I-95 to Exit 1528 - Route 234 North (Managers). Drive about 14.5 miles and make a right at the second light onto Business 234. Drive another 2.5 miles and take a right at the light onto Prince William Street, (before railroad underpass) — follow signs to show car entrance

From I-66 (coming from the west): Travel I-66 to Est 44 - Route 234 By-Pass (Manassas). Drive about 6 miles and make a left at the light onto Business 234 (Dumfries Rd.) Go another 2.5 miles, take a right at the light onto Prince William Steet, (before railroad underpass) — follow signs to show car entrance.

From I-66 (coming from the east): Take I-66 to ext 53A and foliow Res. 28 south, 7.8 miles into Managasa. Turn left onto Grant Ave. (Business 234), go under milroad overpass and left onto Prince William Steed at first light. Follow sign to show car entrance.

From Prince William Parkway (Dale City / Woodbridge): At Liberia Avenue light (where Parkway makes left turn) continue straight onto Wellington Rd. Go 1.3 miles to Grant Ave., and turn right. Turn right at second light onto Prince William St.; follow signs to show car entrance.

Trailers: Instructions above are for show cars. Trailered cars should enter into the Osbourn High School parking lot off Main Street, just south of Prince William Street. Show cars can then be driven to the show entrance. From Osbourn HS. Make right turn onto Main St and go to Church St. Jeft turn onto Church St, then turn left at the light onto Grant Ave (Business 234) go under the nativosed overpass and turn left onto Prince William Street at first light. Follow signs to car show entrance.

Subject: Free C-6, C-7 and C-8 Exhaust Systems

June 2, 2022

I have again made contact regarding having free exhaust systems (CAT back) installed on C-6, C-7 and C-8 Corvettes at Corvettes at Carlisle. At this time, I do not have complete details, but have been told there will be between eight and ten systems installed.

The deal is simple: You would need to take your Corvette to Corvettes at Carlisle on Wednesday, August 24, 2022 after lunch to have the system installed. Then on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday you would need to have the vehicle at Carlisle from 8:30 AM until 5:00 PM. You can either drive back and forth each day, or just leave it at Carlisle, which would be my recommendation as it will be parked under a large tent. Your vehicle will not be driven but will be started so prospective customers can hear the exhaust sound. I was told that systems to be installed will be from Billy Boat, Borla, Corsa, and Magnaflow and possibility one other manufacturer.

I will not have complete details until early August on the model mix, number of vehicles, or the number of systems from each manufacturer.

Whoever gets a system will be on a first come, first served basis. If you are interested, let me know ASAP. <u>I must know: Year, Coupe or Convertible, Base, Grand Sport, Z-06 or ZR-1, Manual or Automatic</u>. This is a great deal as you will be receiving an exhaust system installed that will have a value in excess of \$1,500.00 at no cost to you.

"We came for the cars, we stayed for the people"




