NVCC VISITS ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETERY BY: BOB DEVERY



With an albeit brisk weather day, 13 members of NVCC headed out on the cemetery tram. Our destination was the Amphitheater stop, where we would get to see the changing of the guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. For 98 years, the members of an elite Army company have been responsible for guarding the Tomb and the soldiers who sacrificed their lives during WWI, WWII, and Korea. DNA testing has identified previously unknown remains from Vietnam.

So, we start: Mark Director; Tom Horan; Jane Stieber and Jim Dobish

The perfect rows of headstones, the Cemetery and its 600+ acres has 400,000 veterans and family members gravesites.





New club member Tom LoPresti is a retired Lt Colonel, United States Army. In addition to his combat tours, Tom served twice with the Army's Old Guard company. His second tour was as its commander. Tom reached out to me when I sent out the invite to go to Arlington. The result was incredible as Tom contacted the current CO to get us into the quarters of the guards, called Sentinels. The amazing VIP treatment started with Tom giving us a short briefing on what to expect and where we should go for viewing the changing of the guard ceremony.

A very short distance from where Tom gave us the initial briefing is the gravesite of Audie Murphy, the most decorated service member during World War II. The simplicity of his headstone and gravesite despite his heroic actions that caused him to be awarded the Medal of Honor is common at Arlington and a reminder that our service members do not seek glory. Their priorities are the safety of their comrades and the success of the mission.

In all types of weather, 365 days a year, 24 hours a day, the men and women of the Old Guard are on duty with a constant "21-gun salute" as they march 21 paces; hold for 21 seconds, then march 21 paces and continue for their assigned times of a normal one hour BUT some will do TWELVE HOURS STRAIGHT on occasion!

yet those experiences do not define club standing. We join the club willingly to be equals because equality is what creates the friendship spirit.



OFFICER NOMINATIONS: VICE PRESIDENT & TREASURER


Paul Franklin for Vice President






