

DC AUTO SHOW - NVCC PARTICIPATION MARK DIRECTOR

Three members of NVCC (who are also members of Old Dominion Corvette Club) were invited to show their cars at this year's DC Auto Show as part of the display sponsored by the Corvette Club of America (CCA), Silver Spring, MD. Bob Meyer has his 2021 Red Mist Metallic Tintcoat Hard Top Convertible C8 Stingray, Al Stitt has his 2016 Blade Silver C7 Stingray Coupe, and I have my 1962 Honduras Maroon C1 2-top convertible displayed on the ground floor of the DC Convention Center.

CCA had wanted to showcase at least one car of each Corvette generation as well as showing cooperation between the various Corvette Clubs in the Metro-DC area. Without any C1s in their club, they reached out to Bob Meyer to see if they knew anyone who owned a C1 in either NVCC or Old Dominion Corvette Club. He, in turn, reached out to me, and I happily agreed to show mine.





Wednesday, January 17 was move-in day for the show. Unfortunately, the weather in our region did not cooperate. However, the snow we had on Monday through Tuesday morning, while complicating things, was not so bad as to prevent most people from bringing their cars. I had earlier reached out to NVCC members after I had first been invited to see if anyone could help transport my car on a trailer as I did not want to drive it to the Convention Center. One of our members, Andrej Balanc, generously offered to help, and he picked me up Wednesday morning with his truck/trailer combo.

It was very cold when Andrej first arrived, about 15 F. While it was cold to be loading the car, at least we had

dry roads for transporting it, and to my surprise, it did not need much cleaning once I got to the Convention Center. Bob drove his car that morning and cleaned it at the display point, and Al arrived later in the day.

I was given one of the best locations in the display, right at the front. What an honor, both to be invited and to be placed at one of the two the premier spots! Bob was given the next best position right behind/next to me, and AI is a little further back. There were about 16 cars on display when I left in the afternoon and hopefully a few more will arrive before the show opens, with all generations on display except a C2, the owner of which withdrew at the last minute due to concerns about road conditions.

NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM By: NCM Master Ambassador Dick Hammaker



Dan Binks was no stranger to professional auto racing. Back in the 1980s, he was Tommy Kendall's crew chief when Kendall dominated IMSA's GTU division in a Mazda RX-7. Binks had also worked on

Jack Roush's NASCAR team during the 1990s. By March 2003, he faced a new challenge. The 12 Hours of Sebring would be his first race as crew chief and tire changer on the Corvette Racing No. 3 car.

The helmet that Binks wore on that memorable day is our Artifact of the Month. Painted yellow to match the car, the famous Corvette crossed flags appear prominently on the front of the helmet. A checkered flag pattern swoops around the sides to the back, leaving just enough room for an

American flag emblem and grinning skull and crossbones above the nickname "Big Daddy." Complete with a set of goggles, this helmet is generously on loan from Binks himself. He joins John Amgwert and David Wickman in the Corvette Hall of Fame class of 2023.

Binks used this helmet from his first race at Sebring through the end of the 2008 ALMS season at Laguna Seca. It bears the markings of a long career in motorsports. Along with the usual dents, scuffs, and scratches, the helmet displays an impressive set of autographs. They include racing legends Jackie Stewart and Phil Hill, motorsports journalist Chris Economaki, and astronaut Bruce Melnick.

Binks and the No. 3 Corvette team won that race at Sebring. After the No. 4 Corvette dropped out in the 11th hour with a gearbox problem, the No. 3 took over the lead in the GTS class and led the rest of the way. It was the first victory for Binks on the Corvette team, but far from the last. He remained the crew chief of the No. 3 until his retirement in 2020, becoming one of the most respected members of Corvette Racing. Binks is celebrated today for his mechanical skills and efficient pit stop coordination. His helmet is a unique piece of Corvette racing history, and a reminder of how races are often won in the pits.

We've all hit the "loud pedal" and fancied ourselves a racecar driver. Imagine getting to do it legally (and morally!) on a racetrack. With the capabilities of a modern Corvette, you can take a stock car on many tracks with very little prep! Grab a helmet, change your brake fluid, and get ready to roll!

High Performance Driving Event, or HPDE is a great way to enjoy your car. There are several clubs locally that host these events one day or two at a time but HPDE's are available all around the country. We have a strong gathering of Corvette members that attend these up and down the Eastern seaboard states. You can drive your car with a qualified instructor at high speed on these tracks. World famous tracks like Lime Rock and Watkins Glen, these are a blast!

It takes a LOT of work (and finances) to host one of these events. Our friends at the Ferrari Club of America (FCA) host several of these you may be interested in attending. April 8-9 they will host an event at Virginia International Raceway (aka VIR). You can enjoy some social time after the track goes cold with a banquet or a nice cocktail at the restaurant right on the track campus. They offer trap/skeet and spa packages as well as lots of great views from the Villas of the famous "climbing esses".

May 8-9 is FCA's Watkins Glen (NY) Spring Event. These are amazing events with small run groups and more track time per day than you could imagine! Often there are dinner cruises up Lake Seneca, great seafood at the Lakefront hotel restaurant, or the Stonecat Café for a farm-to-table meal to remember! Take some time to explore the popular antique shops or wineries that dot the area.

June finds the "Tifosi" [*Ed: sports team supporters*] back at it June 28-29 at Lime Rock Park in Connecticut. This was Paul Newman's favorite and a bucket-list track for many. This tiny little track in the valley is well worth the drive up there and back. The social aspects are just as memorable as the track time. Dip into Cannan for a meal or head south a bit to Darryl Hall's House of Blues (of Hall and Oates fame). These are so much more than just a 'day at the track" events or weekends. Often the rooms of the bed and breakfast predate the 19th century and fill you with natural beauty. Be careful, that natural spring swimming pool is "brisk", even in summer months!

The week after Labor Day finds the FCA group back at the "Glen", along with a Ferrari and sports car show in Corning, NY, that weekend. Yes, the Corning of "Corningware" glass, an amazing experience all in its own. Details to come on this one.

These events are lightly attended, very exclusive events. Costs are roughly twice what a standard track day would be. We are invited to these otherwise restricted meetings, and are welcomed with open arms; our longtime friendships benefit the club! Interested in attending? 


OFFICER REPORTS


President- George Durk

Elections are tonight. George read the By-laws. George advised the floor is open to any last-minute nominations for President, Vice President, Secretary and Officer at Large. No other nominations were submitted. Ballot remains unchanged. George advised voting will be online and will start at 7:45pm. Lauri Stevens emailed the invitation to Everyone to vote. Technical assistance was available to everyone who needed it (in person and on Zoom). Multiple laptops were available to cast ballots if needed. George advised everyone the security setting on the application was set to the highest setting. The Software Administrator can see who voted, but not their individual choices. George allowed 15 minutes (7:45pm-8:00pm) for people to vote; however, the voting was kept open for 1 hour. By 8:48pm, all votes had been cast and results are as follows:

The process ran smoothly. No one on Zoom had technical issues. Council positions for Historian, NCCC Governor, and Motorsports are open for anyone to apply.

- Special Recognition- Atty Glenn Wainer was recognized for his assistance with our copyright issue. He was presented with a \$300 gift card to Ruth's Chris Steakhouse.
- Not-for-profit Update-Form 1024 was submitted to the IRS for review of our not-for-profit status. The form was accepted; however, we are waiting for the Determination letter for formal recognition. There is a backlog. We may have to file taxes for this year. George will assist with that. If our not-for-profit status changes, we will receive a refund. CCNV and NVCC can be used synonymously. CCNV has been identified as the successor organization of NVCC. We can file CCNV with the Virginia State Corporation Commission (SCC) to use as an alias. Our logo will remain the same.

Andy Guzman congratulated election winners and provided advice- when faced with a challenging situation just ask yourself "What would George do?" A round of applause was given to George for his tenure as President.

Trivia Questions, Answers and Winners (in bold):

The new E-Ray boasts all-wheel-drive grip, as well as a combined 655 horsepower. Put into effect, it's enough to slingshot the E-Ray from 0 to 60 mph in (2.5 seconds), with the quarter mile dispatched in an estimated (10.5 seconds). **Dave Kuhn**

Similar to the <u>2023 Corvette Z06</u>, <u>Cadillac Escalade-V</u>, and <u>GMC Hummer EV</u>, all of which are considered to be high-demand GM vehicles that could be the target of speculators, the E-Ray will be subject to the same ownership requirements. How long does a new E-Ray owner have to keep the car before selling? (six months) **Bob Meyer**

New 2024 Corvette E-Ray buyers will be required to sign a document which stipulates that if the vehicle is sold or ownership is otherwise transferred within six months of taking delivery, the customer will lose the privilege of placing vehicle reservations or sold orders with a dealer for future high-demand models. These high-demand models will be identified by GM, and may include both future Corvette variants and non-Corvette models.

What is the other major penalty if you sell within 6-months?

In addition, owners who sell their 2024 Corvette E-Ray within six months of taking delivery will risk voiding the warranty on their vehicle. If a new 2024 Corvette E-Ray owner does sell within that sixmonth time period, they will be required to communicate the loss of warranty coverage to the transferee. **Scott Cox**

The warranty covering the 2024 Corvette E-Ray hybrid system battery would not be voided if the car is sold in six months. The hybrid system battery warranty will remain valid for how many years or miles? (eight years or 100,000 miles - whichever comes first). **Mark Waters**

The upcoming <u>Corvette C8 Zora</u> – the eventual range-topper of the <u>Corvette C8</u> family named after early Corvette engineering chief Arkus-Duntov, expected in 2025 or 2026 – will mate the <u>5.5L V8 LT7</u> flat-plane-crank engine (from the <u>C8 ZR1</u>) with an electric battery. What's most unique about the ZR1's 5.5L V8 LT7 engine and a first for a Corvette? (twin-turbo) **Paul Caporossi**

Bonus question

If the Corvette EV or E two-door coupe and convertible becomes the C9 launching in 2027, the C8 generation would be in production for 8 years. What generation would it tie for 3rd place shortest production generation (C5 1997-2004). If it's 2028 and 9 years, it will tie what generation for 4th place? (C6 2005-2013). **Chris Ward**


