Memories of my last trip to NCCAR...

We had just cleared Richmond on 95 South headed down to NCCAR for the day when my ZELLO app chirped letting me know that one of our team needed a pit stop. We made good time with 12 Corvettes and 2 support vehicles in our group. We intended to meet 6 to 8 cars more from Autohaus in Yorktown. It was going to be an awesome day! As we pulled back on 95 you could tell the group was excited about spending the day on the test track as the speeds started to pick up. Just under 3 hours from home, NCCAR (North Carolina Center for Automotive Re-

search - https://nccar.us/ just east of Roanoke Rapids) called to us.

NCCAR is a 2-mile long private test track with great facilities and significantly more track time for the money than some of the better-known tracks. On arrival, Sam - who runs the place - brought us into one of their super clean classrooms for our driver meeting. He was casual yet very



professional and open to understanding what we wanted for our day on the track. He pointed out safety features, and suggested a crawl, walk, run approach to remembering what our limits are — then we headed to the track.

TREASURER'S REPORT AND 2018 BUDGET

The April Council meeting commenced with a lively discussion of the 2018 budget. When the dust settled, we agreed on a final budget, which I present to you here in summary. Because of the timing of our annual banquet and the cash flows associated with it, we felt it makes most sense to set the budget to go from March 1 to Feb 28. This is the time frame we are working with below.

You'll quickly note that this is not a balanced budget! Yes, this was intentional. First, we will be spending extra money in preparation for the big 50th anniversary celebration next year. In order to accommodate that, we considered assessing a special dues increase. However, that eventually fell aside, so dues this year will be the same as before. We also considered chopping the amount spent on banquet prizes, which we did to some extent. This was partly a budgetary move, but also a refocus of the event on comradery. We are still losing money on the banquet, but not nearly as much as past years. In the end, we agreed that the \$8,050 sitting in the bank at the end of 2017 was worth tapping into this year.

For those who want a little more detail, here come some more highlights. The Page car show is intended to generate a little revenue that will go to the Multiple Sclerosis Society. We estimate \$370 in profit and will add \$130 to reach the \$500 pledge to our charity of choice. A big money saver here is the change from a traditional food vendor to using the services of the Ruritan Club. We will cover the costs of food and equipment, but no profits are involved. The Walter Reed car show will essentially be a zero-sum event, but we will split any profit with CCA, who is partnering with us on this event. Finally, the major expense of the year is an estimated \$1600 to prepare for our anniversary. This includes a major friend discount for a full line of logo material design & production (various file formats and sizes, such as vector and raster graphics, CMYK and RGB). We can then apply this new logo to hats, shirts, stickers, and whatnot.

NVCC GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was held at the Amphora Deluxe Diner in Herndon, VA and was called to order at 9:45 am by President Kris McCandless. Kris welcomed all members, including prospects David Field and Sean Hannah. Bob and Karen Shoemaker from Old Dominion Corvette Club (ODCC) attended, as well as former presidents Dick Hammaker and John Palmgren.

Kris thanked Tom and Chrissy Kinman, for donating the cost of this morning's fruit bowl and table cloths to augment the buffet breakfast. He then reviewed some of the activities for today's meeting, to include the raffles and 50/50 drawing.

Kris thanked Marsha Batchellor for consistently producing a monthly newsletter to be proud of!

The minutes for the February 2018 general business meeting were unanimously approved, following which new prospect Steve Dubrey joined the group.

<u>Store</u> – The Club's store manager Tab Tabellario, provided an overview of the raffles for today, as well as various items for sale.

<u>Car Show Planning Committee</u> – John Scott reported that the first planning meeting on March 10th produced excellent results. 14 members attended, team leaders were chosen, and an overview of logistics for the show was discussed. Team leaders so far are: John Scott and Jerry Lelansky – Parking and Registration; Laurie Stevens and George Durk – Trophies; Vicki Scott – Publicity and Bake Sale; Kris McCandless – Page Chevy and Charity Liaison.

The next committee meeting will be held on Saturday, April 7th at Page Chevrolet.

Kris asked members for a show of hands, regarding their level of interest in having a tee shirt designed for this year's show. It was apparent that no tee shirts would be needed.

<u>50th Anniversary Committee</u> – Dick Hammaker briefly described some of the plans discussed at the first committee meeting, which took place at Marsha Batchellor's office, earlier this month.

These include a 50th Anniversary kickoff at the annual banquet in January 2019; an anniversary themed car show; purchasing a 24x24" commemorative brick at NCM (which Dick will purchase on behalf of NVCC); a new Club logo for our 50th Anniversary year (2019), and a second logo to be used in 2020 (and the next 50 years)!

<u>Social Media</u> – Tom and Chrissy Kinman provided handouts in preparation for a special presentation to the group, entitled "It's a Social World"- that described the many reasons to use social media to build the Club's presence online, as well as individual use. We learned more about the social media plan that the Kinmans have designed for NVCC, and the whys and wherefores of timely postings.

Members are encouraged to pique the interest of prospective members via Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, with the use of hashtag and keyword tag (a second handout was provided with a listing of tags that can be used regarding NVCC, as well as those that should be avoided). Everyone was reminded to send photos from any Corvette-related event to 'socialmedia@nvcorvetteclub.com, to be added to the Club's visual archives at Flickr.com. The Kinmans announced that they will soon establish a Google business page and Reddit newsfeed for the Club.

<u>Winery Cruise</u> – Shawn Waddell reported that twenty people have signed up for the RDV Winery cruise (taking place tomorrow, March 25th). They will include NVCC members, a new Club prospect and a couple of Shawn's friends. The winery visit will include a welcome glass of fine champagne, tour of the winery and vineyards, and a vertical tasting of RDV's signature red wines.

<u>Rallye</u> – Mike Gilliland and Dick Hammaker encouraged everyone to sign up for the 5th Annual Corvettes 'n Crabs Rallye, taking place on April 8th. Trophies will be presented for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. There are several ways to enjoy this event: as a rallye competitor; drive the route without clues; make your own way to the venue to enjoy the camaraderie and a delicious meal! The rallye will begin in Dumfries and end at Captain Pell's Crabhouse in Fairfax.

2018 Corvette Final Stats

In what was one of the shortest model years, a total of 9,686 Corvettes were produced. Production started June 5, 2017 and ended January 28, 2018. The plant was down for three months, making the 2018 model year approximately 5 months.

Here's how the options panned out:

39.3% Stingrays; 31.8% Grand Sport; 28.9% Z06 17.5% of Corvettes built were convertibles Automatic transmissions outsold manuals once again at 78%.

The 1LT package was most popular for Stingray Coupes, while the 2LT was the top pick for Stingray Convertibles and Grand Sports. The 3LZ was again the most popular for Z06 models.

Almost 30% of Z06s opted for the Z07 performance package.

Arctic White once again topped the list as most popular color, and for the first time in several years – when you add the two 'reds' together, they don't beat out white (just barely though)!

Here's how the percentages panned out, in order of popularity:

Arctic White – 20.3%

Black - 16.3%

Torch Red - 14%

Watkins Glen Gray – 11.5%

Ceramic Matrix Gray – 11.3%

Admiral Blue – 7.3%

Long Beach Red – 6.2%

Blade Silver – 5.9%

Corvette Racing Yellow – 4.1%

Black Rose - 2.3%

Sebring Orange – .8%

Deliveries of Corvettes were 89% U.S., 6% Canada; 3.5% Europe; and the remaining 1.5% to Mexico, Japan and the Mideast. The Museum delivered 88 Corvettes through the R8C Delivery program.

IT'S A SOCIAL WORLD

Social Media = Awareness Communication. We live in a social world but we don't all use the same social vehicles to communicate. The NVCC has a Social Media Committee to help extend the communication efforts of the club. By posting our activities on several different media vehicles, using business tags, and using hashtags the Social Media Committee serves to help the club with two goals:

Bring awareness & remind members of upcoming club activities

Bring awareness to non-members of club events which in turn can lead to membership growth

A post is a piece of writing or an image that is published on a social media website like Facebook. A post is also called a status update or text. Posts are viewed by people who have friended, liked, or subscribed to a social media site. By using business tags and hashtags in a post the information can now be linked and viewed by other people who are searching for that same tag/category/activity. A Business tag (use the @ symbol) helps to direct people to a business' social page. A Hashtag (use the # symbol) is used to help people find, follow and contribute to a category or a shared interest conversation. Business tags and Hashtags can be used in both text posts and picture posts.

The NVCC **Team Communication Approach** uses the following methods to reach members:

Biweekly emails

Monthly enewsletter

The NVCC Global/ Social Media Communication Approach uses websites to share information

Regular NVCC website calendar updates

6+ weeks out Save the date

4 weeks out Full description flyer

1-3 weeks out Additional graphic post

Business tags and Hashtags allow nonmembers the opportunity to view NVCC posts to receive information on NVCC events and view NVCC pictures from previous activities.

This event is being co-hosted by CCA of Maryland with our club taking the lead on coordination with the USO and the setting up of the event. Between both clubs our goal is to have 30 cars at the event (this is the max allowed due to space restraints), and if we see we haven't reached that point over the next several months of registration, then our council might reach out to other clubs to fill the gap. In these initial stages, we are keeping things close to our club and CCA only for car entrants at this time.




RdV VINEYARDS

When considering new places to visit, I always try to think about past events and what new adventures we could try. So, after listening to a few of my friends and doing some research, I decided to lead the Club to RdV Vineyards (www.rdvvineyards.com). We were not disappointed.



We met at the Home Depot parking lot in Riding Plaza; a few expressed concern with



Ah, the arrival! The gates opened, and we drove through the majestic vineyard, to the spectacular home of RdV. The buildings are white board and batten "agricultural" structures with black stand-

ing-seam metal roofs and a central silo. Their 'guard' dog greeted us with three quick barks for each Corvette, and I think a smile.

Walking into RdV we realized this was something special. The hostesses greeted us with glasses of champagne. We gathered around the huge fireplace with a roaring fire and admired the architecture: soaring oak beamed ceiling, steel and concrete.

The young ladies took our coats. We looked around the vastness of the winery. Connie, RdV's historian and guide hostess greeted us in the tasting area. She told us about how RdV came to be. Since it was too cold to walk the vineyards, Connie guided us to the wine tasting room and began an overview of their operation. She described how the granite was excavated to dig caves where wines are now stored. She also provided a brief history about how their vigneron (winegrower), Rutger de Vink (RdV), chose the location for the granite soil — which is unsuitable for crops but ideal for growing vines. Rutger researched the Blue Ridge mountain region for several years, before

settling on Delaplane.





We continued our tour, walking through the radial barrel caves, past the 12 stainless steel fermentation tanks, impressive machinery and the wine pressing room. On the floor entering the barrel caves is stamped "semper fidelis", which reflects both Rutger's Recon Marine past and the motto of Chateau Cos d'Estournel.

This is truly a first-class vineyard. They focus on two Bordeaux wines, which are outstanding. We thoroughly enjoyed a vertical tasting (2012, 2013 and 2014 Rendezvous and their 2013 Lost Mountain River) with delicious charcuterie trays. We enjoyed the wonderful wines and each other's great camaraderie. A perfect visit!



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
