ODDS & ENDS DETAILING 101 CLINIC APRIL 27, 2019 By Dick "HAM" Hammaker

It was a bright, sunny, windy, beautiful day for 25 ODCC & NVCC Corvette Enthusiasts to learn the basics of Automobile Detailing from the best. Darryl, owner of Odds & Ends Detailing, says "it not just a detail shop, but as a fellow car enthusiast and owner, I can honestly say I'll treat your car as if it were my own. I host and conduct 'Detailing Clinics' to show folks how to get superior results on your own and teach proper techniques to maintain your car to its highest potential."

The Clinic began with donuts, bagels, orange juice, and coffee as well as conversations...great start! The Clinic started with a demonstration on proper techniques to wash your vehicle...wash your tires, rims, and wheel wells first, then two bucket wash technique for the rest of the vehicle and drying techniques.



The demonstrations and discussions continued with how to use the clay bar to remove clear coat contaminants and the difference between paint sealers, waxes, and ceramic coatings. The clay bar was also used to clean the auto glass before using glass sealer. Hand application procedures for applying paint sealers, waxes, and ceramics were also shown.





I love seeing the evolution of the automobile not just in terms of the engine components but, for me, the design changes that have occurred that have caused our Corvettes and other vehicles to become the sleek designs that they have. Of course, there are many people who have no interest in the new designs but simply love the cars from 30 or 50 or 70 years ago not these newfangled veee -hickles! But although I love my C7, I get it when I park next to a Corvette from the 1950s through the 1970s and agree that that car is going to get a lot more attention than mine. When I thought about the idea for jotting down comments about the car shows, it also brought to mind the second part of the equation that is important for me and, thankfully, many members. I've heard Vicki and many others make a comment that is stunningly true: "we join our club because of the cars that we own but we stay because of the friendships". I could not agree more with that correct statement. I joined this club years ago because it



was a logical thing to do. I enjoy the club now because of all of the people who make it special with the time that we spend together talking about cars but, also family, personal experiences and other things that are very important to people. Instead of just talking about cars, our love of the Corvette has given many of us friendships that have much more value than our cars. I've even gotten to travel with friends for a week or more and share the adventures of life which has been an amazing experience for me and Carol.



If you have not yet realized what the true value of this club is, I encourage you to attend some of the myriad of activities that members put together to enjoy life in the fast lane. You can buy a Corvette, but you can't buy the laughter and the Colorado ring that occurs when our members get together. Like many things in life, it's a use or lose opportunity.
