Great thanks to Dick Hammaker for helping with set up and manning the club tent... And reminding me of my military days of getting up at o-dark-thirty each morning.


Also, thanks to Ruth Baumert for her tent duty.

NVCC LEGENDS ATTENDED CORVETTES AT CARLISLE

NVCC was honored to meet two Club legends at Corvettes at Carlisle, Ed "Fast Eddie" Masek and Steve Ballard.

In 1983, Ed Masek was NVCC's 14th President and also Autocross Chairman for numerous years. He organized autocrosses at Old Dominion Speedway in Manassas almost every Sunday during the summer months. Ed drove a race-prepared 1965 coupe named Thumper. When Thumper started, everyone within the Speedway knew it. Ed has owned nine Corvettes (1-C1, 4-C2, 4-C4).

Steve Ballard was the Rallye Chairman for many years. As Chairman, he organizing Rallye 101 for beginners followed by a series of five Rallyes each year. Steve has owned four Corvettes (1-C1, 2-C2, 1-C4).





On Sunday morning August 21, NVCC held its first combination GBM, cruise-in and Luau brunch. Attendance was good considering a week of storm reports threatening Sunday afternoon. Rain did finally decide to roll in around noon, just as the GBM was ending. For most of the event though, the weather was warm and sunny. Despite the rain, it was a successful day.

The bi-planes were flown as the first step in getting a pilot to solo. Upon receiving a license, the pilot could move to more advanced aircraft for training, which finally led to assignment as fighter, transport or bomber pilot. We also enjoyed a special guest appearance by the Red Baron who had a small team to help him in a comedic roll.






