SAVE THE DATE — APRIL 19, <u>2019</u> east region track day at the corvette museum track

East Region NCCC is having a track day at the Corvette Museum on April 19, 2019 and all East Region clubs can participate! Events on Thursday include track time and a driving clinic. On Friday we have a Corvette museum and assembly plant tours scheduled. Box lunches will be provided by the NCM. Some folks are going to spend Saturday up at Nashville, others will be driving back to the Northern Virginia area that day.

The track time will encompass hot lapping time at speed as well as all-you-can-drive parade laps. The day will be split into 30 minute sessions, so everybody will get 2 hours of track time. That's four 30-minute sessions for the hot lapping and four 30-minute sessions for the parade lapping. The cost for hot laps is \$200 for the day and the parade laps are \$50. The parade lappers can run all day long, 4 laps at a time behind a pace car. JUST GET BACK IN LINE! Convertibles are welcome for the parade laps, however, roll bars will be required for the hot lapping (if you have a convertible).

The driving clinic will be held on the skid pad. It will include instruction and practice of front and rear skids, threshold braking and driving a slalom course. The cost for this is also \$50 and it is a great way to improve your skills and see how well your car performs. The clinic is the same as format as our teen driving school, but for the big kids this time!

The event will be open to all the other NCCC region clubs throughout the nation, as well as other car clubs (Camaro, Mustang, Porsche, BMW, etc.). It should be a lot of fun!

We anticipate being able to handle 200 cars that day. East Region drivers will get a significant discount on the above-mentioned prices, as we paid for an acre at the track to help fund costs. Money raised by this event will help defer the cost of that acre, \$15,000.

Rooms are being held at the Country Inn and Suites. More details to follow!

NVCC GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

February 27, 2018—Vicki Allen Scott, Secretary

Officers Present:

Kris McCandless, President John Scott, Vice President John Stark, Treasurer Vicki Scott, Secretary Jerry Lelansky, Officer at Large

The meeting was held at Page Chevrolet in Alexandria, VA and called to order at 7:39 pm by President Kris McCandless. Kris welcomed all members, including two prospect members, Jack and Betty Lou Ludwick. Also present were former presidents Dick Hammaker and John Palmgren.

Introductions were made around the room. Shortly after, a brief discussion ensued, about Coopers Corvettes being back in business (per Omar and Kris).

The January 2018 GBM minutes were unanimously approved.

<u>Annual Banquet</u> – Kris thanked Mae for doing an outstanding job of managing our annual banquet, without a hitch. He also thanked John and Kara Palmgren for helping Mae during the planning stages, as well as setup, for the banquet.

<u>Car Show</u> – Kris handed out a car show task list to attendees and asked them to consider which jobs they'd be willing to help with – and to let John Scott know. So far, Jerry Lelansky is checking on various options for a food truck, and Vicki Scott designed a flyer and will post it on several car show websites in the next week or two. Kris announced that our car show charity will again be Multiple Sclerosis (MS) – and that a planning meeting for the car show that will be held at Page Chevy, on Saturday, March 10^{h} . He encouraged all who are interested in helping to attend – and that the meeting time will be announced as soon as it's confirmed with Page Chevy.

<u>Annual Picnic</u> – Kris announced that the Club picnic will be held once again at Rich Anderson's farm, on July 15th. He provided an overview of Rich's service to the Club, including his extensive collection of cars that includes a Corvette for 6 out of 7 generations. More details about the picnic will be provided as we get closer to the date.

<u>NCM Ambassador</u> – Dick Hammaker reviewed the status of NCM membership in the Club and learned that 16 members hold membership in NCM, and 7 of those are life members.

<u>Social Media</u> – Chrissy & Tom Kinman were not present, however, Kris announced that they'll give a "Social Media 101" presentation during the March Breakfast GBM.

 \underline{Social} – Bob Devery will update the Club activities calendar on the last day of each month. He also announced a dinner&movie night coming up on March 3^{rd} , with future outings to alternate on a weekend, or midweek.

Bob is arranging a tour of the USMC museum at Quantico.

<u>Breakfast GBM</u> – Vicki Scott provided an overview of the Club's Breakfast GBM on Saturday, March 24th. The cost is \$22 per person, which covers the buffet, tax, and tip. The event will be held at the Amphora Diner Deluxe in Herndon. Kris reminded everyone that this event takes the place of the regular GBM meeting, for the month of March.

<u>Corvettes 'n Crabs Rallye</u> – This popular event, in its 5th year, will be a 'gimmick' rallye, wherein there are clues along the route that count toward a trophy at the end. The event takes place on Sunday, April 8th with the drivers' meeting at the Cracker Barrel in Dumfries, VA at 9:45 am. Cars will begin the route (on a timed basis), starting at 10 am. The endpoint will be Captain Pell's Fairfax Crab House. Please let Dick Hammaker know if you want to participate.

<u>Dunkin' Donuts Car Show</u> – Jerry Lelansky gave an overview of this event on Sunday, February 25th. Although it was a gray and rainy day, it was attended by several NVCC members, as well as some from ODCC (Old Dominion Corvette Club). There was a shortage of parking (and some folks left early); however, the free coffee and donuts were enjoyed – as was the attention the crowd gave to our vettes!

<u>Chantilly Car Show</u> – Mike Falletti announced that there will be a car show in Chantilly on March 17th, to mark the grand opening of a smoothie shop.

<u>Transition Brigade Car Show at Walter Reed</u> – Paul Fineberg is working with the USO at Walter Reed, to plan this joint NVCC/ CCA (Corvette Club of America) event, that will be held on Saturday, September 8th. The venue is limited to 30 Corvettes and if Paul hasn't registered that many (between the two clubs), he'll open registration to other local Corvette clubs.

Cooking will be done by Club volunteers, using the well-appointed USO facilities and Paul asked for volunteers to cook and serve food. The USO will provide sodas and ice – and the Base will handle advertising. NSO estimated that 70-80 wounded warriors and family members would attend.

<u>Trivia</u> – presented by John Scott (for Jeff Klain who was unable to attend). The theme was "Oscar week: Corvette goes to the Movies", as follows:

Q1. (For those who've been members for less than two years.) In this 2009 science fiction movie, a future favorite son of Riverside, Iowa "borrowed" his uncle's very vintage 1965 red Corvette, fled a policeman trying to pull him over, and drove the car off the edge of a rock quarry. What was the movie, and who was the driver?

A1. The movie was Star Trek, and the driver was James T. Kirk.

Q2. (For Rick Poage) Over the years, Corvettes have appeared in dozens (if not hundreds) of films. How long did it take for a Corvette to appear in a major motion picture? What was the movie, and what year was the Corvette?

A2. Just two years. A 1954 Corvette was featured in the 1955 film noire "Kiss Me Deadly."

Q3. In the 1992 movie "My Cousin Vinny", Marisa Tomei's character demonstrates her automotive expertise by informing a skeptical prosecutor that Chevrolet first offered a 327 four barrel carburetor engine in the Chevrolet Bel Air in 1964, not in 1955, as the prosecutor asserted. When did Chevrolet first offer the 327 four-barrel in the Corvette?

A3. The 327 was first offered in the Corvette in 1962.

Q4. James Kirk was not the only movie driver to discover that – while Corvettes go fast – they will not fly. This 1997 movie, starring Nicholas Cage, John Malkovich, John Cusack, and Colm Meaney featured a 1967 silver Corvette that flew briefly before crashing to earth in spectacular fashion. What was the movie?

A4. The movie was "Con Air."

<u>TDS</u> – Kris announced that NVCC may hold a TDS session within the next couple of months; however, it will be further considered during the March Council meeting.

<u>Monetary Contribution to Club</u> – Bob Devery presented a check in the amount of \$50, which is a percentage of his earnings from a Caribbean cruise with a few NVCC members, in January.

The 50/50 jackpot of \$32 was won by Kevin Van Sloten.

Meeting adjourned at 8:50 pm.



I've spoken with Amanda Pritt, the Multiple Sclerosis representative and receiving beneficiary, and we are on their schedule. Two April '17 Car and Driver articles

This month's magazine has two very interesting articles. "Power Drunk", an article about testing the Mercedes AMG E63 S, the BMW M5, the Cadillac AC CTS-V, and the Porsche Panamera Turbo. The first page of the article says "One launches from 5,000 rpm, one has a drift mode, one hits 200 mph, and one rushes to 60 mph in 2.8 seconds". My reason for bringing this article up is the BMW M5 runs the quarter mile in 10.9 seconds at 129 mph – um it weighs 4,300 pounds.
