

The 2023 BIG Loop George Durk

My goal was to get an annual Big Loop cruise in before winter ended. Especially, since I had been bragging about doing it since November. However, it turned into a first weekend of spring event. Everything needed to fall in place — my schedule, the Club's activity calendar, temperature, weather forecast and clean roads. Sunday, March 26 turned out to be ideal as a rainy weather front quickly moved through on Saturday leaving us a gorgeous day to cruise.

A little background – this is the Club's 3^{rd} year conquering the BIG Loop. It's not for the faint of heart! Approximately 6-hours and 300 miles. However, we break it up nicely with lunch and rest stops. About 9 cars left our meet-up in the Manassas Cracker Barrell and we met an additional 3 cars in Stephens City.

An interesting side note. When we were congregating at Cracker Barrel, a couple drove up in a pick-up. The driver introduced himself as Dan stating he was in the Club in the early 70s. He had a '66 back then and recalled many club sponsored drag meets at Old Dominion Raceway. He currently owns an '09. Yes, we were encouraging him to join the Club again. He responded maybe, once he sells his RV.

After our Stephens City rest stop, it was time for our first set of twisties. Heading west via Rt 48 through Wardensville, we turned right onto Old WV 55. Most of the road, with its many twisties, is only used by locals since the newer Rt 48 traverses that area of WV. As expected, we had Old WV 55 all to ourselves!

Speaking of twisties, a different kind of twist presented itself the day before. We discovered our usual place for lunch in Moore-field was permanently closed. Yikes! I did some research and the Mexican and Italian restaurants that piqued my interest were closed Sundays. That left either a Bar and Grill that had a smoking section or a restaurant smack in the center of town, Mullin's 1874. We called as we were approaching Wardensville and asked if Mullin's 1874 had enough parking for a dozen cars. They asked, what kind of cars? After responding Corvettes, the response was an enthusiastic yes! Though, upon arriving, I noticed all the street parking spaces on Main St., in front of the restaurant, were available. What a great sight - and it appeared the Wardensville locals driving by enjoyed it as well!

Mullin's 1874 turned out to be a nice restaurant. The staff were friendly, nice ambience and the food was decent. So, we now have our new lunch destination in Moorefield!

After lunch, we lost 4 cars and continued our trek to Seneca Rocks through some twisties on the outskirts of Moorefield. Seneca Rocks is always a nice stop. Unfortunately, the visitor center was still closed for the season.

The next leg of the loop is my favorite, Rt. 33 through 2 mountain ranges to Harrisonburg. Lots of open road through our first mountain range heading into Franklin. Then our next mountain range, which is usually busier, provided some highlights as well. From Harrisonburg to Luray is about 40-minutes via GPS and Rt 81. However, more twisties on Rt 211 heading into Luray!

For our last rest stop, we always stop at the Flotzies parking area in Luray for ice cream. Since Flotzies was closed, 7-11 ice cream filled the bill! Some photos and off to our final leg through the Rt 211 Shenandoah Park twisties. As usual, the first section up the mountain with 2 lanes was awesome!

At Home Tire Replacement by TireRack

[**Editor**'s Note: Members, please give our sponsors, Pohanka Chevy and Radial Tire (in MD) the first opportunity to quote new tires and mounting before shopping elsewhere. Jason did and we are happy. Per Bob Shoemaker, some Costco tire shops will mount the low radius tires our modern Corvettes need, so call ahead.]

In a recent email, I wanted to share my experience working with TireRack's Mobile Installation Service option for replacement of my (gasp!) 19-year-old Eagle runflats, with 2004 date stamp!

I selected Continental ExtremeContact DWS 06 Plus (https://continentaltire.com/tires/extremecontact-dws06-plus), a well-reviewed all-season tire at a good price. Ordered new TPMS right from the site too. I compared with our dealer, DiscountTire, and with Costco (the corvette was not supported at my Costco). Best price was TireRack, and mobile install was only \$30/tire. All in approx. \$1400, but I still need an alignment.

The mobile process was great, easy and professional. They have a Hunter Road Force Balancer TC3500 and Wheel Balancer right in the truck! My tech, Charles, arrived a little early, bonus! He had (2) jacks and the pucks for proper lift. The process took about 15 mins per tire for all steps. Working on the left side and then on the right side he broke down each tire and removed existing weights, then rebuilt the TPMS, tire and valve, inflated and balanced, then prepped for reinstall. After installing, he used a large torque wrench and properly tightened each lug (100 lb-ft) across from one another. Then after all said and done, he brought out the TPMS antenna, and we worked together to quickly link the new sensors to my ECU.

These new tires are amazing, first impressions are 'museum quiet' inside the car. My daughter opened the window because she said it was uncomfortably quiet! Maybe I need some Billy Boats now to fix


that "problem"!

I hope my experience helps you decide getting your next tires mounted at home is worth it!




The first day of Vets 'N Vettes is actioned packed with four hours at the Motor-








GRAND FULL The rest of the afternoon is open to tour the Museum, Cor-







NVCC GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES



OFFICER REPORTS

President – George Durk – According to the lawyer hired by the Club, we are one step closer to becoming a Not-For-Profit. New AOC have been filed w/SCC. Will need to send in last tax return for old club entity (as we were a For Profit organization). We will be a 501(c)7. George's Big Loop was run Sunday, 12 cars, 18 people, new restaurant in Moorefield: Mullen's 1847 (Ponderosa and BBQ place both closed). Big Loop Completion Certificate created by George and John P– for Endurance Cruises. Each attendee will receive this Certificate.

Vice President – Jim McKay – Removing OBXR&C from our events due to lack of interest, though Gene and Angie Kneibert are going. Flyers have been produced for later year events, including Edgar Rohr show in September, Jim suggesting we pre-stage outside the event. Long range plans include looking into the car show at Pidgeon Forge, TN, to possibly replace Ocean City, one of the Club's main events attended by many members.
