#### Home of the Original Rocket Ships: NVCC Visits Udvar-Hazy Air & Space Museum By Bob Devery

With a nice day to get the Corvettes out, 36 members and family met at the Udvar-Hazy National Air & Space Museum for a tour by one of the Museum's docents, Richard Gamm, a former pilot turned judge advocate. All started as planned at 11am as Richard began his tour of the massive complex. The good news is that he decided that instead of rushing through the building in a whirlwind race, he would focus on only a small number of the amazing aircraft that were critical to aviation history ... and for the future.



We started with the basics on Orville and Wilbur Wright but moved quickly to less known aviators and aircraft such as Bleriot and his aircraft that became the first to transit the Channel. Jesser

The WW1 display was next with discussion on Captain Eddie Rickenbacker, an

amazing story of a man who started out as a mechanic (about 1909), became a race car driver, joined the Army and became a driver for General Pershing's team and finally a pilot "during his spare time". There is far too much to mention on his journey from mechanic to the leading WW1 "Flying Ace" with 26 confirmed aircraft shot down. His Army Air Corps Squadron "The Hat in the Ring" is now USAF flying out of Langley with the F22's! One hundred years in a blink! We moved from WW1 and fighters doing 120 mph to the WW2 Lightning P-38 display which focused on Major Bong, the leading ace of WW2 and the 400-mph performance of the aircraft!

There was also a stop at the B29 ENOLA GAY, the most advanced aircraft of WW2 with systems like air pressurization that - thankfully- became a standard item in airliners. The ENOLA GAY was the aircraft that dropped the atomic bomb on Hiroshima which, along with the one on Nagasaki 3 days later, got the war to end.

ENOLA GAY had two memories for me. I had the privilege of being in the cockpit when she was not as beautiful as she is today! The aircraft was in sections at the Air & Space restoration facility in Silver Hill, Maryland, back in 1978-1980. As an air traffic controller at National Airport, I got a chance to go to Silver Hill with a couple of friends to see the aircraft and climb through the sections

to get to the cockpit and sit in the left seat that had been General Paul Tibbets. A friend took a picture which I was proud to give to Carol's dad. He was a B24 pilot in WW2, recalled during the Korean War, and flew B29 missions into North Korea. During one night mission, his formation was attacked by MiG 15's flown by Russian pilots, the lead aircraft shot down with him assuming the lead. Despite severe damage to his aircraft, he stayed with it due to his wounded navigator who could not bail out. His crew "voted" to stay with him, and all landed at Kimpo. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, an honor not wanted but shared by a select group that includes fellow member. Dick Hammaker.

The next aircraft to be visited was the Boeing 707 prototype. While mere passengers were relegated to prop airplanes in the 1940s and 50s, this first jet airplane was originally created as an inflight tanker for military aircraft. We heard a great story about then Boeing CEO, Bill Allen, and for all Club members who love speed and a dare, the actions of one bold test pilot, Tex Johnston, took this 707 prototype into history by doing a 1+ G barrel roll over Lake Washington near Seattle as aviation leaders watched!



To prevent this article from becoming a book, I'll add that our docent finished with Air France's Concorde, flying over 1500 mph to level off at 50,000 feet! The SR-71, the frontal piece of the Museum, made the Concorde slow at over 2,000 mph, and to finish the tour in front of the Space Shuttle Columbia, which flies at a mere 18,000 mph! The Z06 and ZR1 may be impressive but if one feels the need for speed, these three aircraft will push your backs into the seat, along with the new 5th and 6th gen fighters.

Our day finished with a great lunch for 30 of us in Chantilly (across from Pohanka) at Backyard Grill, with



#### **CORVETTE HALL OF FAME—2023**

The members-elect, representing three categories - Enthusiast, Racing, and GM/Chevrolet - will be inducted into the Hall of Fame during a ceremony on Saturday, Sept. 2, 2023.



Enthusiast – John Amgwert, Founding Member of National Corvette Restorers Society.

Helping found the NCRS in 1974, Amgwert went on to serve 25 years as the editor-in-chief of The Corvette Restorer magazine — a trusted resource for Corvette history. His efforts there to form a technical library eventually resulted in what would become the National Corvette Museum.








Racing – Dan Binks, retired crew chief of Corvette Racing. Starting in 2002, Binks was a key member of the Corvette Racing team as racing crew chief, fabricator, and do-it-all competitor, helping the team win more than 100 races during that time, including six class wins at the 24 Hours of Le Mans, three at the 24 Hours of Daytona, and 11 at the 12 Hours of Sebring. After retiring in 2020, he's still busy in his Michigan shop where he now prepares cars he once raced professionally for vintage events, restores race cars, and builds engines.

GM-Chevrolet – David Wickman, retired GM Vehicle Performance Manager of Milford Proving Grounds.

Wickman's lifelong dream of becoming a GM engineer came true in 1978, and his involvement with Corvette dates back to the C4 when he was Test Engineer for the launch of the fourth generation. He went on to manage Corvette development at Milford Proving Grounds as Lead Development Engineer for the C5 Z06, C6, and C7 ... a role in which he oversaw total vehicle development integration and validation from prototype through production.

# E-RAY NEWS READ ALL ABOUT IT

In a rule change dated November 2022, <u>section 1.8 subsection 1 item 14</u> was added to the NCCC Competition Program Rulebook which reads "Electric Vehicles/Hybrids using lithium type battery packs are prohibited in Competitive events. If driven to NCCC events, they should be parked 30 feet minimum from structures or other vehicles. (11/22)"

Section 1.8 covers General Information for all NCCC competitions, and subsection 3 defines the events in question, including "Speed Events" (autocross, drag racing, time trials on road course racetracks, and matching times precise acceleration tests), "Funkhana" (an autocross event with goofy challenges), road rallies, fuel economy challenges, and concourse car shows. That means the E-Ray isn't just banned from track days, it's banned from events driven on public roads and parking lot car shows if said events are sanctioned by the NCCC.


