The Greenbrier is a top-notch resort, situated on 500 acres in beautiful White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia. It is about a 4 -hour drive from Washington DC and is quite scenic the last hour or so. The annual Concours is a Pebble Beach-quality show in our own backyard, complete with period correct attire, fanfare and class. This year was a special tribute to the Packard and there were plenty of pre-war era cars in full trim on the front lawn.





The Corvette was well represented, with each generation

Saturday events include live music, an open concours for all cars and a fund-raising banquet for Children of First Responders. 


What a great collection of cars: all makes and models, new and old, exotics, and of course, Corvettes. A fair share of Porsches showed





NCM LEADERSHIP

Your National Corvette Museum (NCM) is celebrating its 29th Anniversary from August 31st to September 2nd at Bowling Green, KY. I want to highlight the "caretakers" of the 70 year history of America's Sports Car, The Corvette.



Sharon Brawner is the President & CEO of the National Corvette Museum. Brawner is responsible for the overall leadership of the National Corvette Museum and serves on the boards of the NCM Motorsports Park and the NCM Insurance Agency. Brawner joined the National Corvette Museum in 2021 after an extensive career in museum leadership and hospitality. Brawner spent just shy of two decades at the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum, serving most recently as Senior Vice President of Sales and Marketing, supporting the museum's mission of preserving and interpreting the history of country music. Brawner initially joined the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum in 2001 as di-

rector of new business develop-





ment. Prior to joining the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum staff, Brawner was vice president of sales, marketing and communications for the Nashville Sounds AAA Baseball team and, before that, served as the vice president of administration for the Nashville Kats Arena Football team. Early on in her career, Brawner served 10 years in the hotel and hospitality fields within the areas of sales, marketing and corporate partnerships with the likes of Opryland Hotel, Loews Anatole Hotel, Galt House Hotel and others. Brawner is a graduate of the 2019 class of Leadership Nashville and served for 11 years as a board member of the Tennessee Tourism Committee. Brawner attended Western Kentucky University. Currently, Brawner serves on the Kentucky Travel Industry Association's Legislative Committee and Nominating Committee.



Brian Baker is the Director of Collections and Education for the National Corvette Museum as Director of Collections and Education. Baker joined the National Corvette Museum team in 2022 from the Automotive Hall of Fame where he served as Vice President of Education and Principal Historian. 
